Youth Ministry – It's just a

WHEN IT COMES TO DEFINING “YOUTH MINISTRY” I HAVE LONG LIKED THE SIMPLE DEFINITION “MINISTRY TO, BY AND THROUGH YOUTH.” THIS PAST YEAR, AND THIS SUMMER ESPECIALLY, HAS SHOWN ME JUST HOW WONDERFUL BLURRY IS.

Let me explain, sometimes ministries find themselves with very sharp clear edges that define a ministry as “children’s ministry” or “youth ministry.” From Pandamania to Super Servant week I have discovered just how wonderfully blurred those line are here at Cross View. My participation along with several High School youth serving in various roles throughout our week-long VBS (something that might be called “children’s ministry”) involved us all. Even our ValleyFair Day lunch involved adults who have no direct connection to Youth Ministry, helping the Board of Youth to raise funds for the Youth Stock Fund. Youth served shoulder to shoulder with adults at Trinity First during our weeklong servant adventure. The connections made as our congregation continues to carry out blurry ministry is just another sign of our health and vision as a congregation.

What an honor it is to serve among a people who love blurry ministry. There are many ways in which you can cross over that blurry line into the world of Youth Ministry, whatever your age or stage of life. Through our new WE CARE NETWORK we are still looking for

10 adults to partner with one recently confirmed youth, as an encourager. Your role will be as simple as: to pray for them, remember them on their birthday, and greet them by name when you see them. While the role may be simple, the power and effect in the lives of these youth is huge!

Our College Care ministry is another blurry way to be involved, watch for news about care packages, or special needs in support of our efforts to stay connected with our college students. Your generous support of our Youth Stock Fund also allows us to grow and ignite new ministry to, by and through our youth. Speaking of the Youth Stock Fund, over \$6,000 was contributed to the work at Trinity First, based on the votes of the Stockholders at last fall’s Stockholders meeting. This was a larger share than we had planned, but the carpet project became a larger project than anticipated. The results of this project alone, along with the many other projects throughout their building, were amazing!

So do not adjust your glasses – this blurriness is natural – and a blessing!

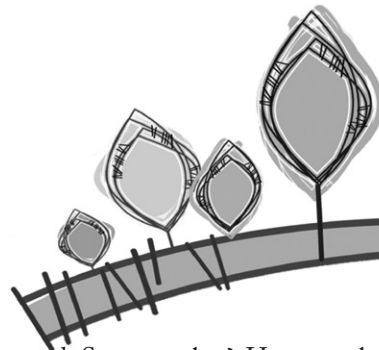

VEAP Back to School Drive Continues Thru August 14; Backpacks Are #1 Need

Each year VEAP supplies the children of low income families in our communities with the appropriate supplies and tools to start a new school year. *The expectation is that in 2011 there will be 3600 children asking for this help.* Each child typically receives a backpack filled with grade appropriate items. In order to accomplish this goal that's 3600 backpacks, 30,000 spiral notebooks, etc., etc., a total of 145,022 items! The items which Cross View has been asked to collect are listed below. *As usual, backpacks are number one on the need list.* It's a good idea to wait until late July when many school supply sales begin. Another hint, backpacks (must be new) are sometimes available and priced very reasonably at garage sales.

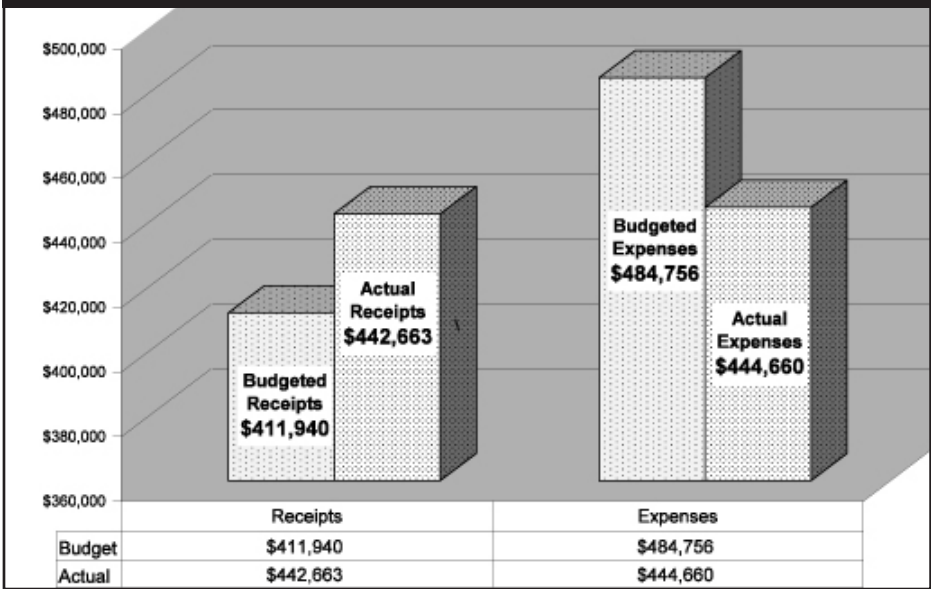

CROSSWAYS INTERNATIONAL CALLING
Be a Part of Monthly Crossways Meetings In Person or Online

When writing this monthly article for inclusion in *The Clarion*, I usually focus mostly on things that are happening beyond our shores in relation to the use of CI's materials. However, in this issue I focus on materials that I write each month—*materials to which you can have access*. On the fourth Thursday of each month, I share biblical insights with a group of people in our office facility—insights designed to help them in their preaching and teaching ministries. You may attend these monthly meetings (90 minutes), and you can have access to these insights in audio and written form on the internet. Just go to CI's website, www.crossways.org, click on Resources, and then Podcasts. In what follows, I share a crucially important insight from the most recent podcast.

"The question for us, God's people today, is: Although we believe in Jesus as forgiving Savior, do we understand what it means to follow Him as Servant Lord in all that we think, do, and say?"

"In all four Gospels, every time Jesus predicts His coming passion in Jerusalem, He refers to Himself as 'the Son of Man.'

The term is drawn from Daniel ch. 7, especially 7:13. The message of Daniel 7, addressed to the Jewish people suffering under the Syrian ruler Antiochus I 'Epiphanes,' during the period 168/167–165/164, is that although they have suffered under a series of foreign powers (the Babylonians, Medes, Persians, Greeks, and now Seleucids), the time is about to break in when they will be given domination and rule over the nations of the world forever. Jesus, the true 'Son of Man,' reverses that hope, and calls His people *to devote life to serving each other and humanity at large forever*.

"The term 'gospel' is used four times in Matthew, eight times in Mark, but not at all in Luke or John. However, Paul uses it 72 times in his writings—and Christianity has by and large focused on Paul's understanding of the term. However, the four Gospels use the term 'Son of Man' 82 times—Matthew 30, Mark 14, Luke 25, and John 13. Indeed God's people need to grapple with Jesus' definition of the term, and its significance for their own faith walk." (End of quote) Profound food for thought!
