

CV 4.0 – Building for Generations Update



Our expansion project is well underway! During the month of May, the construction crew has done a lot of dirt moving to reshape the land on the south side of the building to accommodate the new addition. It might have been a

little hard to watch the trees and courtyard go, but they will all be replaced with something even better to welcome new people and serve our Lord. Footings for the new addition have now been poured and it is exciting to see the new space taking shape. Inside the building the main staircase and half of the narthex is sealed off for safety while construction work happens behind that wall. A new emergency exit has been installed off the narthex. Work has also begun in the ECC to improve classroom configurations. Thank you to everyone for making the necessary adjustments during this time of change! Here are some key changes to keep track of:

Schedule at a Glance

- Total project: May 28 January 24, 2020
- ECC remodel: June 17 September 6
- Sanctuary sprinkler installation: June 24 September 6
- Sunday worship in Fellowship A-B-C: June 30 September 6

Parking and Church Entry & Exit

Despite the loss of some parking capacity during construction, parking is going well thanks both to the Parking Team who directs traffic each Sunday morning and to the drivers who follow their instructions. There is still a need for more volunteers for the Parking Team so that more shifts can be created. If you can help in this regard, please contact Jon Zellar at jonathan@crossview.net. Remember:

- All parking is now in the lower lot.
- Both the upper main church entrance (Door #1) and the lower church entrance (Door #2) have been removed from service.
- On Sunday mornings, enter and exit through the south ECC door (Door #3) and take the stairs to the upper level. The elevator can also be used and two wheelchairs are available if you would like a ride from the elevator.
- Access to the church office during the week (9:00 AM – 4:30 PM on Tuesday through Friday) will be through Door #4, facing the playground—just push the button labeled "CHURCH" for entry.

Worship Space

Starting on June 30th, we have temporarily moved worship to Fellowship A-B-C while ceiling work in the

sanctuary is completed. Air conditioning in the Fellowship Hall (and everywhere outside of the sanctuary) is not impacted by the construction work.

Restrooms

The restrooms next to the narthex (and closest to the sanctuary) are now closed for remodeling. Please use the restrooms near the top of the staircase that we now take to the upper level.

Emergency Exit

Hopefully it is not needed, but since the old Door #1 on the south side of the narthex is now unavailable, a new emergency exit has been installed on the north side of the narthex, where the CONNECT – GROW – SERVE window facing Hwy. 62 had been located.

Nursery

The nursery has moved to the upper level at the east end of the hallway, where the Youth Room used to be, overlooking the ECC playground.

Early Childhood Center

The renovations for the ECC will be happening this summer so that it is finished for the back-to-school period. This includes adding a bathroom and one new classroom, plus a tighter security system for the ECC so that the remainder of the church can be more accessible to the public. A new teacher was hired for this summer to help monitor construction worker foot traffic during ECC hours.

Asbestos

Asbestos was found underneath the 1969 addition narthex carpeting, bathroom flooring, and piping above the bathrooms. We are receiving bids for mitigation. Removal will occur after mid-July. Cross View continues to be a safe building for all. Removal will be done by experts who will exercise all safety precautions. We will communicate additional information as it becomes available.

Financial Update

- YTD income is 6% unfavorable to budget. Budget includes a 9% year-over-year increase
- The net surplus is \$19K favorable to budget due to strong capital campaign contributions resulting in no debt incurred to date and timing of several expenses. The net surplus is \$18K less than May YTD 2018.
- Both operating and capital campaign pledges remain critical in 2019
- Operating costs will not decrease during build.





INTERNATIONAL FRIENDSHIP CENTERS (POBLO) UPDATE

Cross View is blessed to partner with POBLO at our International Friendship Centers (IFCs) in Bloomington, Burnsville, and soon in Prior Lake. Nader and Georgette Alaraj are beginning their third year of ministry among us and more than 25 of our Cross View family members have had the joy of serving along with the Alarajs in their work.

In their latest newsletter, Nader and Georgette explain that when they came to the Twin Cities three years ago, they felt the need "to serve and make a positive difference not just in the lives of internationals, immigrants, and newcomers but within the Church." They wanted to help the Church understand "what is at stake if we do not become involved in spreading the Gospel to internationals, immigrants and newcomers. The Church has a purpose to be in the corner, city and country God placed it in. Jesus commands, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation." What if 'the world' is at your front yard?

People are dying right here in the Twin Cities without the Good News of Jesus Christ! Thank God for the work that is being done through the Alarajs' ministry! Thank God for the many Cross View members who regularly volunteer at the Bloomington and Burnsville IFCs (International Friendship Centers). As Nader says, "We bridge the gaps created by political divisions and Satanic barriers to hinder humanity from knowing and enjoying the presence of God, on earth as it will be in heaven."

Our IFCs are growing with new students regularly joining. We need a volunteer coordinator (can be done from home) as well as volunteers to teach conversational English (Basic and Advanced), Sewing/Knitting, Citizenship and Computer. We also need babysitters to care for children while their parents are in class and drivers who can transport students to class. Gift cards to Walmart or Target and gas cards are always welcome. Our Cross View offerings support the International Friendship Centers, where Nader and Georgette Alaraj serve, through contributions to our South District. In addition, many of our members individually support this work through one-time donations and monthly support. We have recently learned that \$1,300/month is still needed toward the Alarajs' work. PASTOR GEMEDO IN ETHIOPIA

After a brief furlough home to Oregon, Pastor Gemedo has returned to Ethiopia to carry out his mission to help congregations reach out to their Muslim neighbors. He is welcomed by congregations there as they join together to have a "conference." In the U.S. church conferences feature business meetings, resolutions, discussions, and



devotions. Conferences among the Oromo people of Ethiopia, in contrast, are marked by vigorous preaching, prayers, testimonies, and choirs often doing original music. People often go home excited by their faith and eager to share their joy with their neighbors.

After such conferences, often featuring Pastor Gemedo as a welcome missionary from America, he travels to congregations. Gathering local pastors and elders he instructs them from the Bible on how to reach their Muslim neighbors with the Gospel. Many Muslims are very open to the message since, for some, Islam is more of a cultural identity than a vibrant faith.

Because a number of Muslims are coming to the Christian faith, more militant Muslims have persecuted Christians and attacked some congregations. Pastor Gemedo and the congregations there can use our prayers for their mission and their safety.

At the national level, the mission work of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod has been chiefly devoted to theological education in partner churches. This means that almost no mission work in new areas or in congregations is being done by missionaries sent out by the synod. As a result, support for missionaries like Pastor Gemedo, working at the local level, has really benefited by the support from congregations like Cross View.
