Hope in the Wilderness Practical Insights from the Book of Numbers

Who likes numbers? Mathematicians, accountants, statisticians, and investments bankers. The rest of us? Not so much. That's why we prefer biblical books like Jeremiah, Jonah, John, and James. The book of Numbers? Are we really edified by knowing that the tribe of Reuben has 46,500 soldiers? How does that inspire our life of faith?

Origen (c. 185 – c. 253 AD), an early church leader, compared Numbers to food. Did he use adjectives like delicious, delightful, and delectable? Not quite. Instead, Origen described Numbers as food that's "tasteless." He's not alone. Be

honest. Your heart probably didn't leap for joy when you found out that Pastor Steve and I were going to preach and teach on Numbers from July 6–September 7.

Numbers may begin and end with eye-glazing lists—much like telephone books of yester-year. But Moses, the book's author, also traces Israel's journey from Mount Sinai to the cusp of the promised land—describing the nation's highs and lows with dramatic flair. To spice things up, he even throws in a talking donkey! And Numbers has tons of variety: stories, instructions for

worship, legal disputes, census lists, a travel itinerary, and military battles.

There's more. The book paints a beautiful and captivating portrait of Jesus. The background for Christ's Bread of Life discourse in John 6 is Numbers 11—where Israelites complain about manna. And events in Numbers 21 foreshadow Christ's death on the cross (John 3:14–15), providing the backdrop for the Bible's most famous verse, John 3:16. Then there's Balaam. His oracles in chapters 22–24 contain remarkable references to Jesus.

Moses also composed Numbers to show us how to survive during life's in between times.

In between. It's a seminal idea in Numbers, describing Israel's journey to a tee. Moses and crew are bounded by Egypt to the south and Canaan to the north. They're straddling salvation accomplished (at the Red Sea) and salvation to come (crossing the Jordan River into the promised land).

Does this sound familiar? You and I also live between our past and our glorious future. In Holy Baptism God began a good work in us. He will complete it on the day Christ returns (cf. Philippians 1:6).

Moses teaches us what to avoid, what to do, and how to thrive during life's in between times. He also points us to the mercy and might of Jesus who empowers us to stay faithful when we feel like we're circling and stuck in the wilderness. Here's our lineup of remaining sermons:
