

# Songs for the Season

Greetings in Christ! By the time you read this column, we'll have been inundated with Christmas "music" (starting around Labor Day?) on the radio, advertising, mall Muzak, etc., perhaps to the point of being tired of it already. Hopefully our progression of music in worship together in Advent and Christmastide is guiding us through a more uplifting journey that points to the cradle and Cross of Christ—truly the "reason for the season."

Indeed, music has always been a crucial element of our worship, celebration, understanding, and sharing of God's promise of salvation through Jesus Christ. The Psalms are the largest book in the Bible and reveal and relive the gamut of our emotions about and encounters with God. The Bible also contains many "canticles," or non-Psalm songs God's people have been inspired to sing over the ages, such as: Adam's response to God's creation of Eve ("This is now bone of my

bones..." Genesis 2:3), the Song of Miriam and Moses at the Red Sea (Exodus 15), the Song of Solomon, the lyric poems in the book of Isaiah (e.g., "Comfort Ye"), and the Lamentations of Jeremiah to name a few.

In the New Testament, God has blessed us with yet more songs of praise and proclamation. The beloved first chapters of Luke read like a musical theatre script, full of exciting plot lines, journey quests, and characters breaking out into song every few verses! The angel Gabriel announces to Mary in a song-like "aria" that she will bear the Messiah: "Hail, Mary, full of grace! The Lord is with you!" (Luke 1:28b)—the beginning of the Ave Maria that countless composers have set to music. When Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth six weeks later, she pours out the canticle known by its first word in Latin, the Magnificat: "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God,

my Savior" (Luke 1:46a-47). A few months later at John the Baptist's naming ceremony, his father Zechariah, filled with the Holy Spirit, prophesies in song: "Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, for He has redeemed His people...You, my child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High..." (The Benedictus, Luke 1:68, 76a).

At Jesus' birth, the heavenly host of angels sing, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will to all!" (The Gloria in excelsis Deo, Luke 2:14). Yet more people are woven into the story; 40 days after Jesus' birth, He is presented at the temple in Jerusalem where Simeon lovingly holds Jesus in his arms and sings, "Lord, now let Your servant depart in peace. . .for my eyes have seen Your salvation..." (The Nunc Dimittis, Luke 2:29a, 30a). We even get a "reprise" of one of Isaiah's Old Testament songs 30 years later when John the Baptist repeats the Isaiah 40 song, "Prepare the way of the Lord..." (Luke 3:4b).

On the third Sunday of Advent (December 14), we will feature three of these Biblical canticles in our early worship service, starting with a paraphrase of the Benedictus ("Blest be the God of Israel") as the opening hymn. The Handbell Ensemble will play a setting of Mary's Song, the Magnificat ("Canticle of the Turning") for the musical offering. Our final communion hymn will be the Nunc Dimittis ("O Lord, Now Let Your Servant") from the LSB Setting 4 Communion liturgy.

These ancient songs, inspired by the Holy Spirit, have stood the test of time. Musicians have written wondrous music in many styles to help us express their richness and imprint the words on our hearts. Amid the "bleak midwinter" of holiday music that often trivializes Christmas, may we again revel in these ageless songs of the Gospel as we sing them together in community with renewed purpose, meaning, and vigor!



# **Financial Update**

### **Year-to-Date Results**

- Year to date income is \$24,141 unfavorable to budget and \$73,216 greater than YTD 2024.
- The key income driver is member contributions being less than pledged and \$42,025 less than YTD 2024.
- Year to date expenses are favorable to budget, primarily due to lower wages. Missions payments are lower as they are a percentage of contributions.
- ECC Income was unfavorable to budget primarily due to enrollment vacancies and a vacation budgeting error.
- ECC Expenses are favorable to budget primarily due to lower than planned wage and benefit expenses and payoff of 4.0 loan obligation.
- ECC Net Deficit is unfavorable to budget by \$138,533

IRS regulations make it very clear that for a contribution to be credited to the 2025 tax year, it must be received on Cross View's premises by the close of business on Wednesday, December 31st, or postmarked no later than midnight on December 31, 2025. Dropping it off in January with a December date on the check does not qualify.

CarePortal will also be offering an event called COPE, The Cost of Poverty Experience on Saturday, January 24, from 9:00-11:30 AM at Vision of Glory Lutheran Church in Plymouth. The Cost of Poverty Experience is a simulation designed to deepen our understanding of the lived realities and human impact of poverty in America. This event is open to everyone— seasoned responders, new responders, church leaders, and friends.

How CarePortal works; it starts with a child or family in crisis and in need of help from a child/family serving

professional. The child/family serving professional vets and then enters the needs into a request on CarePortal. Local churches and communities then can pray, fund, or supply the items for the families. Cross View has fulfilled 221 requests, served 485 children, and had an economic impact of over \$300,000.
