

Do You?

On May 4, we have the opportunity to witness eleven 8th graders confirm their faith in front of the congregation. What a momentous occasion to celebrate!

It's hard to watch these youth confirm their faith and not think back on one's own confirmation. Standing in front of congregation members, family, friends, and publicly professing one's faith is a big deal.

It's a big deal for these confirmands, but it's also a reminder for us as we witness it. We are called to confirm our faith every day; not just on the day when we are confirmed. We are called to acknowledge the gifts that God gave us in our Baptism daily.

We have been chosen by God, saved by His Son's sacrifice on the cross, and reborn through the waters of Baptism. However, we fail. We sin every day. We don't always live according to God's Word. We don't always remain faithful to the confessions and the Church. We need God's loving and gracious forgiveness. And, in Jesus, that is exactly what He provides! We have a loving Father who sent His Son to earth, to live, die, and rise again for us. He defeated sin, death, and the devil; and because of that sacrifice we have hope and salvation.

Maybe you've been confirmed and remember the questions you were asked. Here are two questions asked when students confirm their faith:

- 1. "Do you intend to live according to the Word of God, and in faith, word, and deed to remain true to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, even to death?"
- 2."Do you intend to continue steadfast in this confession and Church and to suffer all, even death, rather than fall away from it?"

Read through those questions again and reflect on them.

Witnessing young people respond to these questions, full of faith, with "I do, by the grace of God," is very impactful.

While we celebrate these confirmands, and all future confirmands, pray for them. Pray for their contin-

ued faith journey, that they would keep Jesus close, and be able to share God's love with those around them in all that they say and do. Pray that God would keep them faithful in their journey through this life. Then, ask God to help keep you faithful, as well, especially when faced with temptations and hardships.

Will you stand strong in your faith, like these confirmands? Do you intend to live according to the Word of God, and in faith, word, and deed to remain true to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, even to death? Do you intend to continue steadfast in this confession and Church and to suffer all, even death, rather than fall away from it?

Financial Update Year-to-Date Results

- Year to date income is \$8,218 unfavorable to budget and \$23,880 less than YTD 2024.
- 2025 pledges were strong. Timing of contributions versus budgeted timing is likely causing the shortfall.
- Year to date expenses are favorable to budget, primarily due to lower wages and personnel expenses.
- ECC Income was unfavorable to budget primarily due to openings in three rooms and vacation credits.
- ECC Expenses are favorable to budget.
- ECC Net Deficit is unfavorable to budget by \$11,637

CROSS VIEW TO LEAD MUSIC FOR MN SOUTH DISTRICT CONVENTION OPENING SERVICE

Thursday, June 12, 7:00 PM at Concordia University, St. Paul

Cross View Lutheran Church's music program has been invited to lead the music for the LCMS Minnesota South District triennial convention in June. Cross View's Director of Music and Choir Ministries, David Mennicke, is planning and conducting the music for the service. Cross View organist Brian De Young will also serve.

A special Festival Choir will lead the Opening Service on Thursday night, June 12 at 7:00 PM in the Gangelhoff Center at Concordia University, St. Paul. In addition to the Festival Choir, the service will feature a professional brass quartet, the same group that played for Cross View's 8:15 AM Easter service.

Choral singers from throughout the region are encouraged to participate, particularly choir alumni of CSP. In addition to leading hymns and a festival setting of LSB Setting 2, the Festival Choir will sing music to highlight the convention theme, "So That...". Featured choral music includes a newly composed Alleluia verse by David Mennicke, "Create in Me," "Praise His Holy Name," and "E'en So, Lord Jesus Quickly Come."

The rehearsal schedule is flexible and minimal to allow as many singers as possible to participate. In preparation for the June 12 service, choral singers should attend at least two of the rehearsals listed below, *preferably* including the June 11 rehearsal in the Gangelhoff Center at CSP.
