Thomas Edison was one of the most unwavering men of his time. His perseverance and unwavering management of time, resources, and ability led to the invention of groundbreaking inventions in multiple fields such as electric power, mass communications, and sound recording. The invention of the first practical and safe incandescent light bulb in 1879 is but one example. While developing the light bulb, he famously quipped, "I have not failed. I've just found 10,000 ways that won't work."

Christ-followers are also called to be unwavering stewards of the time, resources and abilities that God has entrusted to them. The big difference? God uses His church to light far more than an incandescent bulb. He uses the time, ability and resources of His church to bring the light of Christ to the world!

1 Corinthians 15:58 reminds us: "Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you.

Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain." Unwavering stewardship means a resolute commitment to responsibly manage all that God entrusts to us for His glory and for the benefit of others. It involves faithfully using God's resources for a greater purpose than our own personal gain.

The Barna Research Group reminds us that the primary challenges facing the Christian church today stem from declining biblical worldviews, spiritual apathy, and a growing disconnect between faith and daily life. Unwavering stewards understand that God's greatest gift has made them rich "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich" (2 Cor. 8:9). In response to God's gift to them, they deeply desired to share the love and the light of Christ with others.

#### PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

It is a privilege to partner with parents in the important work of caring for their children, nurturing their faith, growth and development. The Early Childhood Center staff takes this responsibility seriously and values the opportunity to connect with parents. Teachers have been busy finishing student assessments and preparing for parent-teacher conferences that will take place in November. Teachers are looking forward to celebrating each child's unique gifts and progress with parents during this special time together.

#### STAFF TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

The Early Childhood Center staff members have had a variety of training and development opportunities over the past month. Several staff members renewed their CPR and First Aid certifications at the beginning of the month. During the Staff Development Day on October 17th, staff participated in several hours of required training, learning about culture and cultural awareness, as well as Individual Child Care Program Plans. In addition, the monthly visit for the ECC's Child Care Health Consultant was purposefully scheduled for that day to train staff on health policies. What a great educational opportunity for all staff to learn from this valuable resource!

The ECC recently started collaborating with the Minnesota Association for Children's Mental Health (MACMH) to offer Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation for teachers and administrators. This consultation is a free service provided by the State of Minnesota to anyone working in early care

and learning environments to support the social-emotional development of young children.

Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation is a mental health prevention service focused on building adult capacity to support infant and young children's emotional development and to prevent, identify, or reduce mental health challenges. It includes a combination of training, supported skill building, and reflective consultation. These consultations provide guidance, dedicated space, professional support, and valuable resources to help staff navigate a wide range of challenges including transitions, behavioral concerns, developmental questions, family support, stress management, and more.

# Safety and Security M.A.T.

Hello and blessings! Did you know that Cross View has a dedicated team working hard to improve safety and protect our church and neighbors?

The Safety & Security Ministry Action Team (M.A.T.) is actively exploring ways to make sure everyone feels comfortable and secure while enjoying time on campus with friends and family. Although this team is just getting started, they've already begun implementing thoughtful strategies and helpful tools.

- Kingswood Security recently completed a comprehensive on-site security analysis. The team is currently reviewing and prioritizing recommendations. Some of those recommendations have already been implemented: Security cameras have been expanded into Early Childhood Center classrooms, new trauma and first kits were purchased, and emergency information has been posted at all phones.
- Reviewed existing Safety & Security plan with staff. Next steps include training lead volunteers such as ushers, welcome center attendants, and hosts/greeters.
- Team members are meeting with other area faith communities to discuss best practices.

Everyone plays a part in creating a safe, welcoming environment. If you ever notice something concerning or see suspicious activity, please don't hesitate to report it right away—talk to a staff member or usher. Together, we can make a difference!
