Witnesses to His Resurrection

Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, 5 and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. hen he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, 8 and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born. — 1 Corinthians 15:1-8

In the coming month, we will experience an unforgettable journey filled with "ups" and "downs" with "laughter" and "tears" with "seeming defeat" and "ultimate victory." Our journey will lead us down the Palm Sunday road, waving

our branches and singing, "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord." It will lead us up to the Upper Room where Jesus will issue new commands. It will lead us down to the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus will fervently

pray and ultimately be betrayed and arrested. It will seat us through multiple mistrials, including the greatest application of injustice this world has ever seen. It will make us bystanders of the horrors of crucifixion and eyewitnesses to Jesus' resurrection from the dead.

The month ahead includes the holiest week of the Christian church — and with good reason! Approximately 2.38 billion Christians worldwide will pause, reflect, and rejoice at our God's most unexpected solution to humanity's sin-problem... the life, death, and resurrection of His one and only Son, Jesus Christ. No event in all of human history can come close to comparing to the significance and importance of what happened that first holy week and Easter. God carried out his eternal rescue plan for all of humanity — past, present, and future.

In 1 Corinthians 15:1-8, arguably one of the greatest chapters in all of Scripture on the meaning and significance of the resurrection, Paul succinctly summarizes the facts. Apparently, there were a handful of people in Corinth who were raising doubts about the resurrection of Jesus. Paul made it crystal clear that the resurrection of Jesus Christ was at the heart of the Gospel message that he had first preached to them. It was the foundation upon which their entire faith stood. He clearly articulated that the basic message of the gospel was this: "...that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to [many]."

Paul not only reminded them and us of the historical facts that transpired that first Holy Week, but he backed them up with witnesses galore! In 1st century Judaism, truth was confirmed by the testimony of 2-3 witnesses.

Here, Paul offers over 512 witnesses! The post-resurrection appearances of Christ were a critical part of establishing the truth of what had really happened. There were hundreds of eyewitnesses to the risen Christ. All that one had to do in the first century was to ask around. Christians were excited and willing to share the good news... "He is risen!"

Why was this such good news? It was good news because the resurrection meant that the sacrifice that Jesus had offered on the cross and at the tomb for the sins of the world had been accepted by the Heavenly Father. Through Jesus' death and resurrection, He had defeated the power of sin, death, and hell for every sinful human being who puts their faith in Him. Nothing could keep those eyewitnesses from sharing this good news — not the fear or imprisonment, torture, or even death. They had seen the risen Christ!

As we journey through the Holy Week in the month ahead, we too become witnesses to His resurrection as we read, hear, and ponder the truth passed down through the generations. It is good news for us, and it is good news for our world that sits in darkness. Perhaps never in our lifetimes has our world needed this good news more than now. God has made you witnesses to His resurrection. God has planted you right where he wants you to give that witness. May God grant you courage as He opens your eyes to the opportunities in your home, in your neighborhood, in your community, or wherever He has placed you to share the greatest message on earth — that Christ died for our sins, that he was buried, that he was raised, and that he appeared to many...that Christ is risen. He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

As a reminder, in a unanimous decision at the Voters' Assembly meeting last May our congregation approved borrowing \$550,000 to repair or replace several things on the older portion of our building:

- Roof replacement
- HVAC replacement
- Brick and mortar repair

These items needed immediate attention and they were all addressed within two months of the vote, thanks to the

funds made immediately available with the loan! We are grateful to have that much needed work behind us.

As part of the vote, it was stated that a capital campaign would be launched at some future time to repay the \$550,000 loan. That future time is almost here! Fun ideas to do as families

- 1. Biggest pinecone walk. Take a walk around your neighborhood and collect pinecones and leaves. Your bag can fill up quickly, so tell the kids to find the three biggest pinecones or the ones that aren't as cracked/ broken. It is fun to put them in a bowl and the kids love pointing out whose is whose.
- 2. Claim the mundane. Take basic, everyday events and recognize God's presence with our kids. His word is alive and relevant to everyday life. We simply need to recognize His presence and open our eyes to what He is already doing. 6. Pray together as a family.

7. Have a leaf "boat race" at a nearby creek. Drive to a nearby creek, walk down to the water, and throw pebbles. Then, each pick a leaf and float them downstream for a fun race. Be sure to pack bring an extra pair of dry socks and shoes.



HIM: HMONG INTERNATIONAL MISSION WE PREACH CHRIST CRUCIFIED

During the month of February, the Lord continued to bless His work through our family and the Hmong pastors and evangelists in Southeast Asia. However, the devil also worked hard to sabotage the Lord's work by bringing divisions and disunity to many of our Hmong congregations in Southeast Asia. Being members and I, an ordained pastor of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, and my family truly believe that we are teaching the truth in the Gospel through the proper distinction of Law and Gospel, the means of grace, Word, and Sacraments. Furthermore, as Lutherans, we live our Christian lives free from dietary laws and are to love our neighbors as ourselves. Preaching that Christ crucified on the cross for the sins of the world is enough and sufficient for our redemption. Therefore, we trained our Hmong pastors and evangelists these truths in the Word of God. However, these truths were not well received by many Hmong Christians in Southeast Asia. When they heard of our Lutheran doctrines and confessions, they accused us of being cultic and heresy. This led to many of our Hmong Lutheran brothers and sisters in Southeast Asia having to always defend themselves against the reform theologies of glory, prosperity, and decision making. Currently, one of our congregations in Southeast Asia is being sued by a reform church group for teaching and practicing false doctrine of infant baptism and the real presence of Jesus' body and blood in the bread and wine of the sacrament of the altar. We are not sure yet how the local authorities will pass judgement on this little congregation. We need your prayers for them to stay strong in the Lord while they are being persecuted.



This photo is a good illustration of how most of the Hmong Christians in Southeast Asia understand the Word of God. Their confessions of Christ as their Savior gave them salvation, but

they don't see and understand clearly how to live their Christian lives in Christ. For them to keep their salvation secure, they believe they must watch what they do and don't do. Meaning they must continue to practice strict dietary and moral laws. For many of these Hmong Christians, Jesus alone is not sufficient for their salvation. They must perform good works to prove that they are worthy to be Children of God. Therefore, LCMS missionaries like our family must work hard to get to the Hmong people,

so that they will know that "The kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking but of righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit." (Romans 14:17) Please continue to keep the Hmong International Mission in your prayers and continue to support our family by sending us back to Southeast Asia to engage the Hmong in the Gospel's truth and impact them for eternity.

We give thanks to the Lord for His love and mercy for these growths in His mission work among the Hmong in Southeast Asia.

Semiannual Report

Our family sent out over 600 semiannual reports to our supporters. If you have not received a copy of our semiannual report, please let us know and we will mail you a copy. In short, from July 2021 to December 2021, 2,644 individuals heard the Gospel, 493 individuals received Christ as their savior, 272 individuals were baptized, five new ministries were started, and two new church buildings were constructed. - Culture and Faith Art from West Africa Exhibit by Togo artist Fabrice Eteka


