Creation Cries Out

Have you ever had a "God-moment" when you got caught up and captivated by the beauty and wonder of God's creation? I know I've had many such moments. When I was growing up in Oregon, every year our family would spend a week at Pine Meadows Campground located on the shores of Cottage Grove Reservoir. While most people slept in tents and campers, I loved sleeping on a reclining lawn chair under the open sky (when it wasn't raining ?). The deep darkness of the night sky yielded the most glorious view of the stars above. The sheer beauty, unfathomable vastness, and unparalleled orderliness of it all took my breath away. It was a great way to fall asleep!

Creation cries out, doesn't it? Creation cries out to the creativity, beauty, grace, and redemption of our God. From the lilies of the field to the birds of the air to the stars in their courses to the cells in your body...creation cries out! Throughout the forty days of Lent, we have pondered this truth. We have seen how creation cried out through a serpent in the garden, who reminded us of sin's curse and how God took that curse away. The wind reminded us of our new birth. Water cried out to our source of spiritual life. In addition, we saw how creation cried out through eyes, bones, and even Palms reminding us of our sin, our Savior, and our salvation.

With the dawning of a long-awaited Minnesota spring, creation will cry out everywhere we look. As the daffodils, tiger lilies, and hostas pop through the winter soil, they will cry out as living reminders to us of resurrection life that is ours through Jesus Christ, our Lord. From the baby bunnies to the budding trees, creation will cry out with new life. This shouldn't come as a surprise. In Romans 1:20, Paul writes, "For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that people are without excuse." Everywhere we look, creation cries out, reminding us of God's presence, God's power, and God's plan for our lives and for His world that He so loved.

That plan for our salvation reached its penultimate victory at a Garden tomb three days after Jesus' brutal death by crucifixion. There, among the beauty of the garden, creation cried out through a stone that had been rolled away from the tomb. The stone was meant to seal death into its forever tomb. The stone was meant to mark an ending to life. The stone was a hard, cold reminder of the two tablets of stone that reminded every sinner of the curse of death.

Matthew tells us that an angel rolled the stone away in such a way that it was thrown flat on the ground for the angel to sit upon. The stone was out of the track in which it rolled. The tomb was broken! Creation cried out through a stone! The stone revealed an empty tomb. The stone cried out that death was defeated. The stone revealed that Jesus was no longer in the tomb. The angel illuminated what the "rolled-away stone" had made visible. "He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come see the place where he lay..."

The "rolled-away stone" reminds us that Christ has defeated death. The "rolled-away stone" reminds us that Christ's sacrifice for our sin was accepted. The "rolled-away stone" reminds us that the tomb cannot hold us either. Resurrection life is ours! It's a free gift. This is the best news on earth! It is news that Jesus instructed the woman to: "Go and tell..." This news is so amazing and so incredible that we can't contain it either. If we keep our voices silent, even the very rocks will cry out! Let us join with the saints of old and with all of creation that cries out, declaring to each other and to the world: "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!"

UNIQUE GIFTS OF CROSS VIEW'S PRAISE TEAM LEADER

A. There are many styles of music that resonate with people differently across cultures and generations. Music changes and varies but any genre can be used to worship the Lord. Offering options in worship styles allows us to reach more segments of our surrounding community with the Gospel. I pray that we faithfully offer worship experiences that allow people to hear the truth about Jesus without creating unnecessary stumbling blocks.

Q. What are your hopes and dreams for Cross View?

A. I hope that Cross View continues to hold up God's Word without compromise. I hope that the Lord uses our congregation to reach the lost so that more people can be brought to faith and know His eternal promises. May each member eagerly tell others like Andrew did in John 1:41, "we have found the Messiah!"

Q. What is the greatest challenge you face in your walk with the Lord?

A. One of my biggest challenges is recognizing God's goodness and mercy in uncertain moments. Jesus clearly tells us not to worry and I struggle to obey that command.

Q. To whom at Cross View would you write a letter of gratitude and what would it say?

A. I have been longing to use my gifts in a ministry setting for a while and I'd like to thank the leadership at Cross View for the opportunity to do just that. I am amazed at how God has blessed me with a place to use my gifts in both outreach and music. I can't express how grateful I am!
