V-I-C-T-O-R-Y-! We celebrate that our status has gone from restricted to redeemed by Jesus on Easter Sunday! It has been accomplished! One of my favorite worship songs about Easter is "Death was Arrested." It describes our redemption as a great reversal: We are set free and death itself is restricted. One of the verses states:

Our Savior displayed on a criminal's cross Darkness rejoiced as though heaven had lost But then Jesus arose with our freedom in hand That's when death was arrested and my

life began

I was recently in New York to help manage care for my aunt who has suffered a series of strokes. She is struggling to recover physically and mentally. One of the harder moments was when she was excited to see me, and her chair alarm went off as she got up to greet me. Even her joyous moments were tainted by a reminder of her

limitations, her restrictions.

At times, we can become consumed by the things that restrict us in this fallen world. Pain and sorrow, suffering and grief, our own sinful nature it all points us to our restricted status. But Jesus has taken all of it, everything that restricts us, and buried it forever. Death itself has been conquered and the weight has been lifted. We know true freedom because of Jesus. Victory!

So many people around us are still living in this restricted world without knowing the redemption that Jesus offers. They long to be set free. Our calling as Christians is to proclaim His victory and invite others into the freedom that He offers. We have many opportunities coming up at Cross View to actively enter into the restriction that others are experiencing in order to point to the redemption that Jesus has accomplished. Get involved with CarePortal, set aside time this summer to serve through the Rochester Servant Event or the Family Mission Trip to Montreal, attend LERT training to be ready to respond when there is an urgent need, or volunteer to work with new immigrants through POBLO.

As it is written in 1 Corinthians 15:54-57, "When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory. 'Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?' The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." Nothing, not even death can restrict us now that we are set free in Christ. Let's celebrate the victory!






