

Redeemer, My Healer

During the month of April, we look forward to celebrating Easter together. It is the pinnacle of the church year, marking the moment that our redemption was won through Jesus' death and resurrection, conquering the sin barrier forever!

As we continue to journey through the final weeks of Lent internalizing Scripture and reflecting on the barren landscape of our own hearts, I am moved by the ways that God offers us healing. He not only brings about the complete restoration of our souls through Jesus as our Redeemer, but He also invites us to know His healing hand even now while living in this fallen world. No matter what pain you carry from the past or what you currently battle, He invites you to bring it to Him. God knows you, knows your hurts,

and wants to carry those burdens for you.

Some of us struggle with deep pain caused by something more traumatic such as the sudden death of a loved one, devastating loss of possessions, or betrayal by someone close to you. I received training through Trauma Healing Institute this January in order to facilitate a Healing Group at Cross View this spring for those looking for healing on a deeper level. You can learn more about this opportunity on page 4 in this issue of the *Clarion*. As our world increasingly seems to encourage us to claim our struggles as our identity, Jesus asks us to bring them to Him and lay them down. Matthew 11:28-30 says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give

you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." This does not mean that we ignore what has happened in the past or its impact on us, but we are able to continue moving forward with God's grace into the opportunities and experiences He has in mind for us. 2 Corinthians 9:8 reads, "And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work."

During this Healing Group, participants will find support through God's Word and discover the power of connecting with others. The curriculum has been used around the world to help people heal from the pain of trauma, grief, and

loss. After experiencing the training, I believe everyone would benefit from participating in a Healing Group because it offers a way to acknowledge your own scars and equips you with tools for helping others around you who are struggling.

What a gift it is to know that our Redeemer and Healer is always near, always opening His arms to us, always eager to bring about restoration. Below are some of the lyrics from "Your Great Name" by Krissy Nordhoff and Michael Neale that touch on transformational love of Jesus. May you experience the healing touch of Jesus in the areas of life that have been painful, and may you rejoice daily in the complete restoration He has won for us on the cross.
