Nestled away in the suburbs of San Jose, California, is a house built by the heir of the Winchester rifle fortune. In 1884 a wealthy widow, named Sarah Winchester, began a thirty-eight-year construction project. Winchester was convinced that continuous building would appease the evil spirits of those killed by the famous Winchester rifle, "the gun that won the West." So, she kept carpenters' hammers pounding for 38 years. *Thirty-eight years!*

The Victorian mansion came to be filled with so many unexplained oddities that it's now known as the Winchester Mystery House. Even though it has 160 rooms, three elevators, forty staircases, and forty-seven fireplaces, its size alone doesn't account for the architectural marvel. It's called the Winchester Mystery House because stairs open up into ceilings. Windows decorate the floor. And doors open into blank walls! Busyness, not blueprints, defined success. Profusion, not a plan, was the goal.

The Winchester Mystery House is what many churches look like. *Busyness, not blueprints, defines success.* Profusion, not a plan, is the goal.

How can we make sure Cross View stays focused and moving forward? We turn to Paul's letter called Romans.

In 1545 Martin Luther recalled reading Romans 1:17 as a young monk — some thirty years earlier — and being struck with God's free gift of salvation. The Reformer writes, "Here I felt that I was altogether born again and had entered paradise itself through open gates." Luther's friend and fellow-reformer, Philip Melanchthon, called Romans "a compendium of Christian doctrine." The letter quickly became the foundation for Lutheran thought and life.

It is fitting, then, that Cross View *Lutheran* Church take up Romans to sharpen, highlight, and further our understanding of what we're doing and why we do it. I'm calling this series "The Church's One Foundation." Here's our line-up of sermons:

- August 13: Our Mandate, "In view of God's mercy ... be transformed" (Romans 12:1–2)
- August 20: Our Motives, "Christ-Centered, Discipleship-Directed, Family-Focused and Mission-Minded" (Romans 1:16–17)
- August 27: Our Mission, "Connecting People to Jesus" (Romans 8:28–39)
- September 3: Our Map, "Bring, Belong, Become, Bless" (Romans 12:9–16)

Bible studies on August 20 and 27 will present **Our Marks**, "Doctrinal Beliefs, Practices and Virtues" (Romans 6:1–11).

Helen Keller was once asked, "What could be worse than being born blind?" She replied, "Having sight without a vision." That's not us. Through this series God will give us more than sight. He will sharpen our vision for Cross View. I invite you to attend, learn, and prepare for the next chapter for Cross View. What a wonderful time it will be.


BIBLE STUDY FELLOWSHIP (BSF) FOR WOMEN & PRESCHOOL CHILDREN

Cross View women, please join us for Bible Study Fellowship's study of John on Tuesday's from 12:30–2:00 PM.

Women today face a multitude of challenges, like struggles with insecurity, broken relationships, guilt, overwork, or loneliness. Countless women have found peace, comfort, hope, security, and answers to life's big questions by exploring God's Word. As a group member, you will personally study Scripture and answer questions each day. Once a week, you will meet for a small-group discussion of the lesson, hear from a teaching leader how


the truths of Scripture can be applied to daily life and receive comprehensive notes on the Scripture passages you studied.

BSF's Preschool Program gives children a biblical foundation upon which to build a love for God and spiritual matters. Loving, well-trained and committed leaders teach little ones about God and the Bible in age-appropriate ways. The leaders pray for the children and encourage them to continue learning with their registered adult throughout the week. (The preschoolers' curriculum is based on the lessons the adults study to help foster spiritual conversations at home.) The children also learn other important life skills, such as how to obey instructions, cooperate, sit, and listen — all taught in an atmosphere of love.

COLORADO SPRINGS SENIOR HIGH MISSION TRIP

God met the Senior High youth in a literal and figurative mountaintop experience on the Colorado Springs mission trip in mid-July. Along with two other churches and several college interns from Next Step Ministries, the group served in the Colorado Springs community, worshiped together, built stronger relationships with God and each other, learned new skills, met new people, and grew in their faith. Thank you for your support, encouragement, and prayers!

The Cross View group of 14 youth and four adults was divided into two work groups for the week. Since one of the rental vans held a maximum of 7 passengers and there were 7 male participants, it became clear how the groups would be divided...

The boys' group learned a lot about using new tools, the importance of accurate measurements and trust in God as they worked on a variety of projects, including building a fence, a gate, and a relationship with an elderly woman in the community. The boys had fun swinging axes to remove tree stumps and using their muscles to move a large tub of dirt. They also poured concrete and helped build a shed at a local

church. Ask them about their fun toolkit team name and nicknames.

The girls ascended Pike's Peak to the Crystal Reservoir every day to paint and stain railings, log seating at an amphitheater, several bathroom buildings, a shed, and the trim of a gift shop. Amazing views at the worksite location, chipmunk companions trying to join the group for lunch, devotions by the reservoir, and interacting with visitors, rangers, and other workers were some highlights for the girls' group.

All groups also spent one evening playing with children at Family Life Services while the moms attended class. A meal was shared by all, many played tag or parachute, some made sand art. Several youth and adults lent their faces as a canvas for face painting from the sweet children. It was a meaningful time of interacting with them, filled with lots of smiles, laughter, joy, and love.

Join us in praising God and giving Him the glory for an incredible trip! Please continue to pray for and encourage the mission trip participants as they bring home what they learned and share their gifts, experiences, and God's love to those around them in Minnesota too.

Sharing Highs and Lows

In just 5 minutes a day you can have a family devotion. Pick a time. It can be at the dinner table or before bed...whenever. Here is the simple structure.

- 1. Share a Bible verse. Here are some examples: John 3:16, Deuteronomy 6:5, 1 Corinthians 13:13, Jeremiah 29:11, Matthew 28:5-7, Mark 2:23-3:6
- 2. Share highs and lows from the day. Highs are always required but lows are not.
- 3. Ask what is God telling me?
- 4. What am I going to do about it?
- 5. Bless one another.

Once you get used to this structure you can add another question that can be asked during highs and lows which is "What mistake did you make today?" Be sure to answer it yourself too. It shows that not everybody is prefect, and we need God's grace. Secondly, it lets kids practice talking about their mistakes with their parents while the stakes are low, which hopefully will make them more likely to talk when the stakes are higher. It also presents an opportunity for family members to apologize to one another if it is needed. Be vulnerable with them because it will show them how to be vulnerable with you. Finally, you can also ask "How can I be praying for you?"

BE WITH HIM AND SERVE HIM

Often in our conversations with one another at Cross View we fail to share our interior life of faith, how we are personally growing in our daily walk with Jesus. I asked one of our vital members, Carol Niemera, these questions so that our readers might be encouraged in their lives of discipleship.

Q. Who has God put in your life to inspire you to follow Jesus more closely?

Jesus himself through his words, Paul, and authors of the Bible; and books and speakers help me learn about Jesus, i.e., Pastor Wheeler and Dr. Lessing, Dr. Jordan Peterson, author Pastor Timothy Keller, and other biblical authors.

Q. "I am with you always, to the close of the age." How is that promise comforting to me?

A. This is the most important scripture to me personally as I used to wrestle with feeling alone being an only child. Believing this scripture started me on the road to peace, recognizing that in the end, we are all alone with God at the end of life. This scripture has helped me become courageous and accountable for my time spent living on earth. Now I know I am never alone — that none of us who believe are ever alone, that we are born with Him, we die with Him, and while we are here, it is most important that we be with him and serve him. It is most important to know this. We are never without him unless we do not recognize him.

Q. What is the most amazing thing about God's grace?

A. First, it is most amazing that God continues to love people despite their sinfulness and awfulness and hardness of heart towards him and other people; and second, that his love is so great for us that he has provided a perfect "savior" for us that we may be in his holy presence and care forever.

Q. What have I found to be the most challenging thing about following Jesus?

A. Dealing with myself and educating myself to deal with people as Jesus wants me to deal with them can be a challenge. Jesus says, "Apart from me, you can do nothing" so I need to remember to get out of my own way and pray to Jesus (and listen) and ask myself WWJD?

Q. How do you maintain joy in your daily life?

A. I maintain my prayer life and an attitude of gratefulness in my prayer life, recognizing my time here is a gift, and



knowing that God is in total control. The frustrations in life are not all there is and they, too, will pass, so I make sure daily that I am serving God! And I try to remember the words "If Jesus is for me, who can be against me?" Knowing I am not alone and knowing he will help me, I can be more courageous and less fearful. Lastly, believing in Jesus' love for me makes forgiveness of myself and others possible. This gives me peace and joy.
