# Bethlehem's Gift A Redeemer for All

Let's face it; the season of Christmas isn't always easy for everyone. Hurts of the past and wounds of the present often seek to rob us of celebrating God's greatest gift. Christmas can be a difficult time for those who struggle with depression. Christmas can be heart-wrenching experience for those who mourn or struggle with the loss of a loved one. While the season of advent and Christmas is often marketed with joy and cheer, the reality remains...we live in a broken world where love, hope, peace, and joy seem to continually fall under attack.

This Advent, we are going to engage in a sermon series entitled: "Bethlehem's Gift – A Redeemer for All." As we journey through

the Old Testament book of Ruth, we are going to see that **love**, **hope**, **peace**, **and joy** can be found by all, even in the messiness of life's many challenges, sorrows, and disappointments. Rather than simply pretending that all is well this advent and Christmas season, we are going to explore how love, hope, peace, and joy can abound even in the midst of brokenness.

The book of Ruth presents us with a beautiful story of redemption in the midst of the many and very real challenges of life. From the opening chapter where Naomi, Orpah, and Ruth all lose their husbands and find themselves alone in a foreign land, to the closing chapter where Boaz (the kinsman redeemer) pays the price of

redemption to ensure that Ruth and Naomi's name and inheritance would never be lost, we see God's hand of grace at work. The book foreshadows with breath-taking parallels another gift that would one day be given in Bethlehem – Jesus a redeemer for all. In fact, Obed, the child eventually born to Boaz and Ruth would be the Father to King David, a direct descendant to Jesus.

As we make our way through this season of advent, I want to challenge you to feast on the Soul Food of the book of Ruth. Each week, I would like you and your loved ones/family to spend some time reflecting on a single chapter of the book of Ruth. Read the chapter and then use the guide below as a discussion starter.

- Dec. 1-7 Ruth 1 LOVE Describe where you see love abounding in the midst of broken hearts in this chapter. How might God use you, like Ruth, to share His love with someone whose heart is breaking this advent?
- Dec. 8-14 Ruth 2 HOPE Discuss how

- hope exists in the midst of hopelessness in this chapter. How has Jesus brought hope to seemingly hopeless situations in your life in the past? How can Jesus use you to bring his hope into the lives of others?
- Dec. 15-21 Ruth 3 PEACE Talk about how peace meets unrest in this chapter. Share a time when God brought peace to the unrest of your life.
- Dec. 22-28 Ruth 4 JOY Compare and contrast chapter 4 with chapter 1. Discuss what brought unspeakable joy to unimaginable sorrow. What comfort and joy does Bethlehem's Gift bring to you, even in the midst of your sorrows?

As you dig into God's Word this advent, exploring the book of Ruth, I pray that our Lord will allow these discussions to be a blessing for you and for those you love. May you find renewed love, hope, peace, and joy through the greatest gift ever given... Bethlehem's Gift – A Redeemer for All.

# CV 4.0 – Building for Generations Update



Advent is the season Christians prepare for the coming of Christ. We read special devotions and prepare our hearts and minds for the birth of our Lord and Savior. It's a time to reflect, prepare, and get our house in order.

Families work hard to get their home in order. Childhood Christmas memories include special church services, singing carols, and special company coming for Christmas dinner. Children anxiously wait to open gifts. It's hard to wait. It's harder to not peek.

Cross View members continue to wait to worship our Lord in the sanctuary. We wait and wait while workers put up walls, wire lights, and go about expanding the Lord's house. Advent is about preparation. Construction is about building. Christmas presents are exciting. Worshiping in the sanctuary will be uplifting.

Why is it taking so long to get back into the sanctuary? At first, we anticipated a return in early November, then by Thanksgiving, then early December. Now it looks like a sanctuary Christmas celebration is doubtful. Delays provided opportunities for an acoustical study to accentuate our pipe organ. Sub-contract negotiations created additional funds for LED lighting, cedar ceiling, and wire infrastructure for future theater lights, future sound systems, and a future video enhanced system.





Advent, like construction, is a time to prepare. Just like the child wanting to peek downstairs Christmas morning, we want to sneak into the "construction zone" and sneak a peek. Peeking where you shouldn't brings trouble. Construction zone practice is to allow only pre-approved people with a hard hat, vest, closed toe boots, and permission to walk in the construction area. Strict enforcement prevents injuries and lawsuits. Liability rests with the general contractor and Cross View.

Our construction site experienced two forced entries this fall. Fortunately, no damage or thefts occurred. Intruders look for tools, copper, and other items to sell. A video security system that calls the Edina Police was installed to stop unauthorized entry. Anderson Companies activates the security system anytime workers are not onsite.

Cross View's 4.0 Building For Generations continues to move forward. A wet summer, labor shortages, and delays to ensure members receive the maximum value from their donations pushed the project completion date back from the end of January to the end of February.

Advent is a time of joyful celebration as we await Christ's birth. May our hearts be full of love, patience, and appreciation of our opportunity to expand His house and bring more people to know and live the true meaning of Christmas.

### **Financial Update**

- October year-to-date income was 4%, or \$36K less than budget. Budget includes a 9% year-over-year increase. The 2020 budget will be proposed to the Voters in January. We continue to expect the need to increase annual income 19% in 2020 to meet expenses related to our expansion.
- The net surplus is \$22K favorable to budget due to lower expenses than planned. On November 19 we had our first draw on the construction loan and will now begin to pay interest monthly on a growing loan balance.
- Your generous contributions to both the operating and capital campaign remain critical in 2019 and as we look ahead to our first year in the expanded space in 2020. Cross View council thanks you for your prayerful giving during this exciting time in our history.

November was a very busy month at the Early Childhood Center with fundraisers and conferences. Our fundraisers included the Scholastic Book Fair and Night Owls. We raised over \$500.00 from our Night Owls event. We received over \$700 in Scholastic dollars, in addition to 50 books for our classrooms, from the book fair which will be used to purchase educational items for the classrooms. The monies raised from Night Owls will be used towards purchasing new items for the facility.

Conferences were held throughout the month of November. This is a time that the teachers and parents have a chance to connect and discuss the progress of their child/children. Conferences are held twice a year and are vital for the success of the children.



A quote from Stephen Ministry founder Kenneth Haugk, in his book, Don't Sing Songs to a Heavy Heart:


