- 2. Donations from Thrivent Choice, memorial gifts, and donations from church members have helped us to fund repairs and buy

needed items

- New families that have started to fill our program to capacity: referred by many of our current families, but also past families
- 4. An amazing school age program that brings back past families and kids to continue their friendships and hearing about Jesus
- 5. Books, toys, diapering paper, and other items donated to help stock our classrooms with all the necessary supplies
- Congregational members who help repair worn out and broken items (we are so grateful; you truly are a gift from God)
- 7. A healthy center: very few COVID cases this year ©.

However, with all the gifts we are blessed with, the best gift of all is Jesus, "Baby Jesus" as the ECC kids would say. We get to worship Him in chapel, say prayers before meals, read about him daily, and sing to Him. Now is the best time to thank God for his greatest gift to us, His Son at Christmas. Baby Jesus is the true Gift of Christmas. Jesus came to earth to give us life – eternal life! That is the most amazing gift we

could ever receive.

So, during this last month of the year, as you look back at all the amazing gifts you or your family have received, remember that every good gift comes from God and that the greatest gift is eternal life.

# **Financial Update**

### **Year-to-Date Results**

- October 2022 member contributions were 64% of budget or \$58,102 less than budgeted. October expenses were \$27,572 less than budgeted.
- Year to Date income is 8.81% below budget or \$96,606 less than budgeted.
- Year to Date expenditures are \$66,399 less than budgeted primarily in lower wage expense due to open positions.
- Year-to-date General Fund Deficit of \$91,662 is \$30,207 worse than planned through October. We pray for contributions in the final two months to make up this deficit by year end.
- ECC income is at just \$1,229 shy of plan and expenses unfavorable to budget, resulting in a net surplus less than budgeted by \$25,848.
- Each contribution reduces the loan balance and Cross View's interest cost — enabling those funds to support ministry programs.

The children have worked hard, and it will be a wonderful worship service.

### **PARENT CORNER**

### **Christmas Game #1: Christmas Carol Freeze**

In this fun Christmas game, kids will run around the room. But they'll have to listen carefully! When you shout out the name of a Christmas carol, kids must freeze in place in a pose that represents that song. There's no right or wrong pose, so let kids have fun and express their creativity! Here's a list of songs you can name:

- Hark! The Herald Angels Sing
- Little Town of Bethlehem
- Joy to the World
- Away in a Manger
- What Child Is This?
- We Three Kings
- Go Tell It on the Mountain
- Angels We Have Heard on High
- Silent Night
- It Came Upon a Midnight Clear

After the game, lead kids in this discussion. Ask:

- 1. Why did you decide on the poses you did?
- 2. Which Christmas carol is your favorite, and why?

Say: Christmas songs are a fun way to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas. Jesus came to earth as a baby, born to be our Savior.

### **Christmas Game #2: Shepherd's Telephone**

Your kids will love this fun game of Telephone! Kids will sit in a circle or a side-by-side and whisper a message down the line. The messages will be things the shepherds might have told people.

First, read Luke 2:17. Then whisper the following messages to the first child in line, one message at a time. Let kids whisper the message all the way down the line or around the circle and have the last child announce aloud what they heard. Have kids whisper these messages:

- We saw a whole bunch of angels.
- The angels told us they had good news of great joy.
- The Savior was born today in Bethlehem.
  - We got to see baby Jesus wrapped snugly in strips of cloth.
  - Jesus was lying in a manger.
  - Jesus is God's Son the Savior of the world!
  - You have to go see him for yourself!

If time allows, kids can also make up things they think the shepherds might have told people.

After the game, lead kids in this discussion. Ask:

- 1. What happened when you shared your messages?
- 2. What do you think happened when the shepherds shared their messages?
- 3. What's one thing you can tell someone about Jesus this Christmas?

Say: The shepherds were so excited because they knew Jesus wasn't an ordinary baby. He was God's Son, the one they had been waiting for to save them! Like the shepherds, we can tell everyone the exciting news about Jesus!

### **SAVE THE DATES!**

Sunday, January 22, during the Sunday School hour 9:30-10:30 AM the Children's Ministry MAT will be putting on the first ever **Mission Sunday for the Sunday School kids**. Mission Sunday is a festival where Sunday School children appreciate and deepen their understanding of the mission focus of Cross View through education, games, donations, relationship building, and, of course, treats. We hope this carnival-like atmosphere will help the children grow in their faith and learn about service, thankfulness, and world mission.

Friday, January 27, starting at 5:30 PM the Children's Ministry MAT will be putting on another new event for families called **Popcorn, PJs, and a Movie**. We will supply fun treats while families can gather for some fellowship time watching a movie together.

### **KIDSTITUTE NEWS**



# Focus on the Family of Cross View by Paul Emmel

### **SHINING LIGHTS**

In any congregation there are "shining lights", fellow members who are living examples of what it looks like to be a Christian. These are people in our midst whom the Spirit uses as lights to guide and inspire us.



One of the many people in Cross View that brighten the way for me is Vina Marquardt. I thank God for her and share this interview so others in Cross View might acknowledge those who light up the way for them.

### Q. What has been your history with Cross View?

A. I joined Cross View, along with my husband, Karl Nilsson, in 1998, transferring from Bethel Lutheran Church in St. Paul, where I had been a member since the 1970's, after moving to the Twin Cities, following college.

We joined Cross View, partly because of location and partly because of the recommendation of friends, but, more so, because of the preached and taught Word of God, the music and social ministry programs, and the welcoming and engaged congregational members. As an answer to prayer, Karl was baptized, as an adult, by Pastor Nadasdy, when we joined.

# Q. How has Cross View nurtured your faith during those years?

A. My faith has been nurtured by many of the same things that brought me to Cross View in the first place, including worshipping with the fellowship of believers; hearing and studying the Word; celebrating and receiving the Sacraments; joining in music that glorifies God; participating in outreach and service ministries; growing deeper faith relationships with others through small groups, ministry involvement and service projects.

Q. How would your life be different if you weren't part of the Cross View family? A. Because God has planted me here, right now, I "belong" to Cross View's unique Body of believers, made up of 'real people', who laugh, cry, struggle, study, and worship together. The joy of recalling many people who have welcomed and loved me as part of this church family over the years, is still vivid. And, yet, every Sunday, is a 'new day' to meet and know and love someone new, a fellow believer on earth's journey, heading to heaven, as part of God's family.

# Q. How do you see yourself fitting into The Body of Christ at Cross View?

A. I see myself fitting into the Body of Christ at Cross View where and when God calls and leads me to say "yes" to opportunities, ministries, and needs, but that doesn't mean I say "yes" to everything. But I find joy in worship and fellowship, participating with other believers and servants, because we're "just people" doing kingdom work together, stepping in when asked or encouraged, whether we feel "qualified" or not. It's the Holy Spirit using me and working through me for the "right fit" at the right time.

Q. What recent trends in congregational life concern you? A. I don't really have concerns about our congregational life at Cross View, but I wonder how we might continue to build relationships with those who don't look, sing, talk, dress, worship, and act exactly like we life-long LCMS/Lutheran people do. Although we are blessed to have an East Indian Christian community worshipping in our building every Saturday, and we support the POBLO ministry, most of us, including me, have never worshipped, or participated with those ministries. So, an openness to break out of our comfort zone and be inclusive and encouraging of those diverse "others" who love Jesus, would be a good trend, in my humble opinion.
