Undeserving Love

When I hear the words of the article title, I am reminded of the Vacation Bible School song the ECC children learned called, "You Forgive Me" (2017).

You take all the pieces of my heart
Put them back together make it all alright
Oh, You forgive me
Only You can heal my broken heart
Make all things new with a brand-new start
Oh, You forgive me

You forgive me
I try so hard to do things right
But I make the wrong choice sometimes
And You forgive me
No one knows me God like You
You see who I am not what I do
And You forgive me

We all have had moments when we have made a wrong choice and turned away from a friend,

a parent or even from God. In the parable of the prodigal son (Luke 15), the son runs away from home, spends his money foolishly and wastes his time on worldly desires. When he hits his lowest point, he decides to return home to ask for a roof over his head and the daily essentials if he can work as a servant for his father. When the father sees his son coming down the road, he could have built up his anger and frustration as his son approached, however, the father's heart is tender and shows his forgiveness as he lovingly embraces his son. CV 4.0 - Building for Generations Update



Completion of the **4.0 Building for Generations**building project is scheduled for February 26th. This is also Ash Wednesday, the beginning of our Lenten journey to Easter Sunday and the celebration of our Risen Savior.

February will bring together numerous construction puzzle pieces. Aligning the project conclusion with Lent symbolizes Cross View's goal to expand God's work through His Great Commission. Future ministry opportunities will bring more people to know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

Many subcontractors will spend February working on their parts of the construction puzzle. A partial list includes:

- Completing the sanctuary ceiling, LED lights, cleaning, organ refurbishing and reinstalling pews.
- New kitchen equipment installation.

- Interior work including painting, suspended ceilings, wall coverings, cabinets, carpet, tile, and signage.
- Multi-purpose room audio-visual equipment installation.
- Youth area furniture and audio-visual equipment installation.
- Voice Over Internet Protocol (VOIP) phone system installation.
- TV installation for announcements and educational programming.
- New furniture throughout the new addition.
- Returning ECC, Sunday school rooms and offices to their appropriate locations.

As the **4.0 Building for Generations** project moves towards completion, let's prepare our hearts and minds to grow the love of Jesus through Bible study, Christian fellowship, and the creation of new opportunities to expand His Kingdom.













Financial Update

RECAP OF VOTERS' ASSEMBLY MEETING JAN 19, 2020

2019 Full Year Financial Results Reviewed

- In 2019 Cross View receipts increased 9% compared to 2018 to \$1.16M and were 1% (\$15K) unfavorable to budget
- Expenses were \$73K favorable to budget, or 6%, resulting in a \$57K surplus. The primary drivers of the expense favorability are noted below:

 Expenses below budget 	Favorability
- Debt Service	\$25K
- Christian Education	\$24K
- Wages	\$13K
- Marketing	\$9K
Total	\$71K

- Debt service was lower than planned due to 4.0 Building for Generations pledges being fulfilled earlier than expected, resulting in minimal borrowing to date. Saved interest expense means more funding for the project, Praise God! Christian Education and Marketing were favorable due to fewer programs offered due to the lack of space during construction. Wages are favorable due to open positions.
- The general fund remains strong at \$224K (19% of income)
- Early Childhood Center financial results were largely plan with a small deficit of less than \$1,000

2020 Cross View Budget Approved

- A receipt increase of 15% (\$169K) is required to cover incremental cost in 2020 and produce a balanced budget
- 2020 requested expenses have been restrained to offset some expansion related increases. The primary 2020 cost increases are noted below:

• Expense drivers	Increase vs. 2019
- Debt Service (interest for new mortgage)	\$116K
- Wages (music program and full-time janitor)	\$59K
- Utilities and Insurance (50% more square feet)	\$47K
Total	\$222K

- Continued early fulfillment of 4.0 Building for Generations pledges directly reduces the amount of debt service, producing funds for other ministries
- The 2019 \$57K surplus will be reserved for unexpected/unbudgeted required costs in 2020
- A balanced budget including a 2.9% average tuition increase was approved for the Early Childhood Center

4.0 Building for Generations Pledge Receipt Update

- 85% of pledges totaling \$4,053,000 have been collected
- Thank you for the accelerated pledges! Every dollar remains essential to the project and early pledges received reduces loan interest expense!



Endowment Fund Update

- Fund was established in 1996 but has not been promoted for several years. A \$38K balance exists in an LCEF account with \$9K interest available to use
- The Endowment Fund bylaws are outdated given Cross View Policy Based Governance structure adopted in 2014 and require amendment to improve control and management oversight of the fund
- LCMS Foundation management is recommended by the Council
 - Foundation is proven, provides improved controls, established in 1958, \$956M assets under management
- LCMS Foundation would own, invest, manage and administer the fund in exchange for a 1% service fee on account assets
- Town Hall meetings will be offered to discuss bylaw changes in detail and gather congregation feedback
- Bylaw amendments related to the revised Endowment Fund will be proposed at the May 2020 Voters' Assembly Meeting

This month our extended group of Stephen Ministers (Cross View's team combined with Our Lady of Grace's team) is reading a simple but profound book, "Sleeping With Bread". The main subject centers around gratitude and discerning God's presence in our lives, based on St. Ignatius of Loyola's ancient practice of the Examen. Quoting a recent "Spiritually Speaking" article in the *Eden Prairie News* by our Stephen Ministry leader, Beryl Schewe, reviewing this book:

"Gratitude is a sneaky habit. The more you practice, the more you notice things you are grateful for... Gratitude can flip our thinking upside down...The examen is powerful because of its simplicity and call to action. "Sleeping with Bread" suggests you reflect on two questions each evening, perhaps over dinner if you share a meal with others.

What brought you the greatest joy today?

Noticing a daily greatest joy helps reinforce a practice of gratitude. Even on our toughest days, we reflect on what glimmer of joy entered our lives and give thanks to God.

What brought you the least joy today?

Pondering what brought me the least joy helps me realign my life. What do I need to change? What should I be more specific in praying for? What is really bothering me?

When I make a practice of paying close attention to my day, my "noticing muscle" gets stronger. I find that it's easier for me to notice when God shows up, particularly on days when I'm overwhelmed by the painful parts of my life."

In 1 Thessalonians 5:18, Paul says, "In everything give thanks, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you." If you are going through a hard time and having trouble giving thanks, a Stephen Minister can come alongside to listen and pray with you. Please contact a pastor for more information.

RED LETTER CHALLENGE

COMING TO CROSS VIEW - LENT 2020

What would happen at Cross View if we took the words of Jesus, read them, and actually put them into practice? What kind of response would our non-Christian friends and neighbors have to us? It seems like a simple idea, right? Sometimes it's difficult to begin or to know where to go once we start.

This Lent, beginning on Ash Wednesday, Cross View will kick off this "Red Letter Challenge" (RLC) - a 40-day challenge where we as brothers and sisters in Christ are challenged to read the words of Jesus for 40 days straight. We'll do this by reading daily devotionals, attending Bible studies that go along with what we are learning, listening to sermons Sundays and Wednesdays, and by being challenged in our walk with Jesus each of those 40 days.

We'll learn five principles that were important to Jesus: Being, Forgiving, Serving, Giving, and Going. This church-wide campaign

is based on the book *The Red Letter Challenge* by Lutheran pastor, Zach Zehnder. He wrote it with the hopes of equipping Jesus' followers through 40 days' worth of readings and challenges to practically and daily live out our faith. Following Jesus is simply reading His words and then

acting on them.

If you've never heard of Jesus – this challenge is for you. If you've known Him for your whole life – this challenge is for you. If you've been waiting to invite the spiritually curious friend from work or yoga class with thought-provoking

questions about faith – this is the study to get them involved with at Cross View.

We're challenging small groups and everybody to meet six times from February 25–April 5. If you're not in a small group, but interested in serving as a host or facilitator for a Challenge Group (Lent only), please contact me at toby@crossview.net.
