

Go Fish!

As I was thinking about the phrase Equipped to Go, it made me think about fishing. Do you enjoy fishing/ice fishing, or have you ever caught a fish?

Fishing is a great sport, and if you have ever been fishing and have caught a fish, you know that there's a great feeling of excitement when you catch a fish. One of the things that makes fishing such a great sport is that it doesn't matter if you're young or old...you can still be good at fishing.

What does it take to be good at catching fish?

First, you need to be properly equipped. You can't just get a piece of string, put a hook on it, and tie it on the end of a stick and expect to catch many fish. If you're serious about fishing, you'll make sure you have all the right equipment.

Next, you need to know that you have to go where the fish are to catch fish!

Finally, if you want to be good at fishing, you must be patient. Sometimes the fish just aren't biting. You must wait patiently.

Matthew 4:19-20 talks about how Jesus was walking along the seashore when he saw two

brothers named Peter and Andrew. Jesus knew they made their living by fishing, so He called out to them, "Follow me, and I will show you how to fish for people!" Do you know what they did? They laid down their fishing nets and followed Jesus.

Jesus wants us to fish for people, too. We do this every day here at Cross View Lutheran Church but also in the Early Childhood Center.

First, we need to be properly equipped. We need to know what the Bible teaches and learn how to share it with others. In the ECC we equip all the children with God's word every day. But a special event takes place every year where we present our 4-year-olds with their own Bible. More info on that later in the Clarion with pictures.

Next, we go out where the people are and tell

them about Jesus. Cross View Lutheran Church and the Early Childhood Center do so many outreach events to tell others. In the ECC we have shared about Jesus to the Edina police and other police stations in the area, to animal shelters, and homeless places by making cards and sending gifts.

Finally, we must be patient. In the ECC it can be hard to be patient. But we teach the kids every day about having patience and waiting.

If we will do these things, we can really become fishers of people like Jesus wants us to be. If you think there is a great feeling of excitement in catching a fish, just imagine how exciting it must be to bring someone to Jesus! We are all Equipped to Go and catch some fish for Jesus.


PENGUIN CLASS RECEIVES BIBLES

Did You Know?

If you are 70 $^{1}/_{2}$ or older, you can make gifts directly from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to Cross View without paying federal income tax on the withdrawal. Here's how it works:

- You must be age 70 ½ or older when the gift is made.
- You must request that the IRA Custodian make a direct transfer to Cross View for the gift to be tax-free.
- Each person is limited to \$100,000 per year of giving.
- Gifts can be used to satisfy your required minimum distribution each year.
- Funds held in other retirement plans such as a 401(k) or 403(b) are not eligible but may be rolled over to a standard IRA to then be used for a tax-free gift.





PARENT CORNER



Look here monthly for tips and resources to help you be your child's key faith shaper at home!

Active Indoor Games (to break up the cabin fever!)

Belly Laugh: This silly game reminds kids that God loves a joyful heart.

- Bible Connect: Psalm 9:2; Psalm 28:7
- Play: Choose one person to start the game by shouting, "Ha!" The next person will shout, "Ha, ha!" and the kids rotate to add a "ha" as they work around the group. Sooner or later the kids will burst into laughter. Optional: Have one child lie on his or her back. Then have another child lie with his or her head on the other child's belly. Have the remaining kids lie down with their heads resting on another child's belly.
- Cool Down: Let kids take turns telling a funny story or joke. Tell kids that God wants us to experience joy every day through fun and laughter.

Apples and Oranges: This crazy game will help kids discover everyone is important in God's family.

- Bible Connect: 1 Corinthians 12:12-27
- Stuff: You'll need an apple and an orange.
- Play: Form a circle. One child will pass an apple to the right around the circle. Another child will pass

an orange to the left around the circle. The key to this game is that kids can't pass the fruit with their hands. Kids can use their feet, elbows, or knees to pass the fruit. If someone drops the fruit or it touches the ground, the child must close his eyes to continue playing. Play continues until only one person with his or her eyes open remains.

• Cool Down: Ask kids to talk about what was easy or difficult about the game. Ask kids what it was like to play with their eyes closed and how that affected the game. Help kids make the connection between this game and God's family. Celebrate everyone's contributions and emphasize everyone's special role in God's family.



This was truly a Redeeming Christmas gift from the hearts of our members to the families of Los Vásquez, Guatemala. Thank you, thank you, thank you!

On Thursday, January 13, 2022, the Guatemala Mission Action Team had a ZOOM call with Charles Cohen, our missionary on the ground in Guatemala, and Lori Newhouse, the director of Central America Lutheran Missionary Society. We informed them of the wonderful news, and they are incredibly

thankful. Because of Cross View's generosity, we are working on some enhancements to our project. These enhancements will make a good plan even better!

Following our meeting, we were told in an email that the people of Los Vásquez are thrilled with the prospects of a new water system. There are thirty men, poised with their shovels, ready to begin the process of replacing the old PVC pipes. Once the enhancements are reviewed by the engineering company, the digging will begin.

LINC TWIN CITIES MINISTRY UPDATE

Greetings,

LINC Twin Cities (linc.org/twincities/) has experienced the greatest season of growth in its history. It all begins with the amazing Ministry leaders spread across the cities sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ in various ways by different means. LINC Twin Cities has more than 150 individuals and groups who have heard the call of Almighty God. LINC has the extreme pleasure of walking along side faithful, inspired, men and women sharing tools, connections, thought, and many other resources as needed.

As an example, Pastor Jordan Borer Nelson is a young African American man who has seen his share of trouble and heartache. Residing in North Minneapolis during extreme crime and hardship, he is a beacon of light for Jesus. Jordan has a



lived experience only he should share. Over the past 18 months Pastor Nelson launched his church, Foundations Church in North Minneapolis (www.foundationschurch2020.org/) during COVID-19. Jordan's philosophy in Ministry is "meet them where they are." In doing this, Pastor Nelson goes out on the streets and meets the gang members in their brokenness and begins by kindly loving on them. He draws young men and women into the conversation about life, then shares the power of his own lived experience. In just 12 months the membership at Foundations Church has already reached more than 50 worshiping every week. In addition to this amazing church plant, Jordan also started the Youth Empowerment Center (YEC), a Christian non-profit focused on teaching teenage boys and girls how to write programming code. A motto of Jordan's is "Tablets for Guns", he knows and believes empowering the youth to tap into unused abilities is key to providing channels toward success. Multiple connections to LINC Twin Cities have met Pastor Jordan Borer Nelson and are deeply interested in supporting his ministry works.

Alfredia Baldwin recognized a calling to build a totally independent Christian schoolhouse. Frustrated by what she identified as "systematic" destruction of Christian children through the carnal public school system, Alfredia set on a course to



research, develop, plan, build, and launch a non-traditional Christian schoolhouse. Alfredia, having the skill and tenacity of a retired attorney has built many relationships along the way. A true modern-day maverick, this amazing Black woman takes the issue of the body of Christ properly educating its children quite serious. Always looking to champion for the children and build new means by which to educate them, Alfredia exemplifies what LINC Twin Cities is proud to call LINC Leaders.

Both Alfredia and Pastor Jordan Nelson has been identified as LINC Twin Cities "Impact Leaders of the Year."
