But most important, remember that God has sent YOU a love letter, and in that letter, God promises that he will love you – NO MATTER WHAT!


Financial Update

Year-to-Date Results

- December member contributions were 117% of budget or \$32,372 more than budgeted. December expenses were \$1,066 less than budgeted.
- 2022 income was 5.48% below budget or \$76,763 less than budgeted.
- 2022 expenditures were \$97,477 less than budgeted primarily in lower wage expense due to open positions.
- A General Fund Surplus of \$20,714 was realized as contributions exceeded expenses for the year.
- ECC income was \$3,817 less than plan and expenses \$35,850 unfavorable to budget, resulting in a deficit of \$39,349 for the year.
- The ECC raised tuition rates in December to help offset rising costs.

Traditional Worship Services Return to Communion at the Rail

Do you remember June of 2019? It was in that month that worship services were temporarily moved into the fellowship hall while construction work was completed on our sanctuary. With that move, our distribution of communion had to be adjusted to a continuous flow process. The goal was to resume communion at the rail, following the completion of the build.

As you know, in 2020, a worldwide pandemic emerged. With state-mandated social distancing requirements and heightened concerns about the spread of germs, we continued to use continuous flow communion. In addition, we switched to trays with disposable cups.

It was always our goal to eventually get back to the communion rail. On February 12, 2023, we will resume our beloved practice of communing at the rail for tradition worship services! In response to requests from our altar guild, and in an effort to provide safe distribution, we will continue to use trays with disposable cups. Because it has been a while since we have used this distribution practice, below are some reminders.

As you are dismissed by ushers and approach the rail from the center aisle you will approach the communion cabinet.

• Gluten free wafers and grape juice will be available on the cabinet

- Kneel at the first available space nearest the center aisle
- If you have a gluten free wafer or grape juice, wait for the communion assistant to say, "The body of Christ..." or "The blood of Christ..." before consuming them. If you are receiving the regular wafer or wine, you may consume them once you have received them and the communion assistant has spoken.
- After communion (and prayer, if you choose), return to your pew by an outside aisle. These walkways are located on the front walls of either side of the sanctuary. On the organ side of the sanctuary, this means using the walkway that goes behind and around the organ. On the side of the sanctuary with the larger screen, it means using the walkway directly beneath the screen.
- If you would like to commune, but are unable to come forward, please inform an usher.

We rejoice that after several years away from our communion rail, that we can once again commune together around our altar. If you have any questions, feel free to ask a staff member or a member of our usher team. See you at the altar!



Outreach & Missions

A STORY OF APPRECIATION AND PRAISE!

Since 2019, Cross View has partnered with a small village in the western highlands of Guatemala. The name of this village is Los Vásquez. There are roughly ninety families living in Los Vásquez, and they are primarily coffee farmers. When we first visited with the leadership of Los Vásquez, they told our mission team their number one need was water.

During multiple mission trips, our mission team closely studied the water system in Los Vásquez. We found significant leaks in the system and a lack of storage capacity. Cross View hired a Guatemalan engineering company to develop a plan to replace the water system.

In December of 2021, the members of Cross View generously donated to: A Redeeming Christmas II. This fund-raising effort was to completely

replace the water system. Because of Cross View's generosity, we were able to fund a transformative project, providing a totally new water system for the entire village of Los Vásquez, Guatemala. As of the end of July 2022, this project has been successfully completed!

This project was a partnership with the people of Los Vásquez, the mayor of the local province, Cross View Lutheran Church, and CALMS (Central American Lutheran Mission Society.) The people of Los Vásquez provided a substantial portion of the labor, the mayor provided heavy equipment for the digging of the main holding tank and Cross View provided the funds for the design of this project, the skilled labor and all the materials needed to complete this project. CALMS helped coordinate the project. The good news is that this project came in exactly on budget!

The collection site is located about two miles above the village of Los Vásquez. Rural Guatemalans do not dig wells but rely on streams coming down the mountain side. Water is collected and then distributed to the communities.

Virtually every able-bodied man living in Los Vásquez, was out with a shovel and pickax digging trenches for the new pipes. The men of Los Vásquez dug a trench about one foot deep and over two miles long, from the collection site to the main holding tank. This was down the mountain side and the soil is hard and rocky.

The newly constructed main holding tank now holds about 25,000 gallons of water. A three-inch pipe carries the water from the collection site

structure to the holding tank. There is a chlorinator for the system, providing a cleansing process for the water.

In addition to the main holding tank, there are three distribution tanks located strategically around the village. Each of these distribution tanks hold about 10,000 gallons. There is now about 55,000 gallons of holding capacity. This is an increase of about 50,000 gallons in holding capacity as compared to the original system.

The men of Los Vásquez dug an additional three miles of trenches to connect each of the distribution tanks, to the individual home. Now, each and every home in Los Vásquez has a new water spigot.

When we visited Los Vásquez in July and November, we heard many thank yous for the new system and saw tears of joy.

Laurie and Tom Koch were present in November for the celebration and dedication of the new water system. The whole village turned out for a church service of praise, village wide meal, and dedication of the new system. Outside of their church, they built a fountain, celebrating the new water system. Cross View's name is prominently displayed on a plaque,

giving thanks for our contribution. They specifically told me they wanted a cross on top of the fountain, so they are reminded of the contribution Cross View provided to replace the water system.

The priest for the district celebrated the new water system during the church service. Following the church service, Cross View hosted a community wide meal, feeding about 600 people.

Plaques of appreciation were presented to the mayor of the municipality of La Union, Cross View, Helio Ramirez, the general contractor, and CALMS. During worship service on Sunday, January 15th, members of Cross View's Guatemala Mission Action Team, RoseAnn Meier, Laurie Koch, and Vicki Barton, presented these plaques to Julie Marquardt, Cross View president.

Thank you, Cross View, for making this Redeeming Christmas project a great success. This water system holds about 55,000 gallons of water for 90 families. Thank you for providing the families in Los Vásquez with clean, drinkable water.

You have made a tremendous difference for our brothers and sisters in Christ, living in Los Vásquez.










The new study book is entitled "Measured by Grace" by Sharla Fritz. The focus of this study is how God measures our worth: by His Grace and not as the world does.

CHURCH GRANDPARENTS

Thriving congregations are built upon the foundation of "grandparents"; long-term members in the same church for two or more generations. Not only do these veteran members provide good role models for younger members, but they provide the leadership of wisdom that comes only with time and experience. They have observed the growth process over many years, even beyond pastors who come and go in the history of a particular congregation. I interviewed Tom and Laurie Koch who are prime examples of Cross View's many wonderful grandparents.

Q. How did you become connected to Cross View?

A. After moving to Edina, we wanted to join a church close to our home. We visited Cross View once and found it very welcoming church that preached and practiced the Word. We have never looked back. In fact, after Tom's dad passed away, Tom's mother joined Cross View and we soon had 4 generations of Koch's at Cross View, all sitting in the front pews. Our 3 children were confirmed at Cross View. Two of our children and their families belong to Cross View. All 5 of our grandchildren have been baptized at Cross View. Although our youngest grandchild lives in Chicago, her parents wanted her baptized at Cross View. Our oldest grandson was confirmed at Cross View two years ago and his younger brother is currently in confirmation. To say that Cross View has a place deep in our hearts would be an understatement.

Q. How has Cross View helped you grow as a disciple of Christ?

A. When we joined Cross View, there was an expectation that church was not just for Sunday mornings, but a church where it was important to be active and alive in Christ. This included both participation in Bible study and volunteering on church boards and wherever an extra pair of hands might be needed. We have always felt fulfilled by the in-depth Bible studies at Cross View. Our faith walk has been strengthened through these studies and through the word preached each Sunday. Over the past 35+ years, our faith has grown greatly thanks to the Christ-centered focus of Cross View.

Our walk has also been strengthened by our volunteer work at Cross View. Laurie taught Little Lambs for a number of years, served on the education board, on the Board of Spiritual Care as a deaconess, vice president and president of the congregation, and is currently a Stephen Minister. Tom served on the Board of Stewardship, Board of Worship and Spiritual Care, served as an elder, and president of the congregation. Both of us have been on long-range planning committees and call committees for various church positions.

Now that we are retired, our work for Christ has

extended to serving Cross View by serving the people of Los Vásquez, Guatemala. The Guatemala mission project brings together much of what we learned through our years at Cross View and through both of our professional lives. We



are truly honored to work with the people of Los Vásquez.

Q. How has our congregation helped you represent Jesus in your professional lives?

A. We participated in a number of Bible studies that helped us reflect on making ethical and moral decisions, both in our personal lives and in our professional lives. Listening to other members in the congregation talk about how they were able to navigate difficulties and use a Christian approach to solving problems strongly influenced our own professional lives. Jesus provides us with many examples of how to work with other people. We are so thankful to the congregation for their willingness to share their own stories of frustrations and successes. Each of these stories provided tools for us in our own work.

Q. What are your hopes and aspirations for Cross View in the coming years?

A. Cross View has changed greatly in the past 35 years, and not just the physical structure. When we joined, Cross View was quite small and needed only one service on Sunday mornings. Everyone knew everyone else. We have always been a church strong in the word, with hearts for others, and a joy in the fellowship of other Christians. We have seen how Cross View has changed its focus from looking inward to helping its members grow in faith by reaching out to our local communities (PABLO and Trinity First) and to the world (Tenwek and Guatemala). It appears the world has become smaller, and we hope that our collective hearts as Cross View grow bigger to continue to share the love of Jesus around the world. We also want to continue to support the mission of teaching, preaching, and fellowship of Cross View members. We hope that our doors will be open to receive others into our church body so they too can experience the many joys and blessings we have received in our church home.
