

# **New Beginnings**

HAPPY NEW YEAR! Most people take time in January to make New Year's resolutions. I believe it's because we hope for, and want to make, "New Beginnings." But as far as this tradition goes, I've never really jumped on the bandwagon. Maybe that's because I've never really been a part of either the 45% of Americans who usually make New Year's resolutions, or maybe it's because I don't want to be a part of the 92% of those who don't succeed at them (statisticbrain.com.) I mean, why go through all that torment and disappointment? (No one wants to feel like Charlie Brown lining up

for a kick only to have the ball pulled away and end up with a bruised tailbone).

However, New Beginnings are important. Starting off fresh is important. Moving from 2020, 2021, remembering; not forgetting, but remembering who we are in Christ. I believe we should start off every day in January remembering God's words to us in 2 Corinthians 5:17, "If anyone is in Christ, He is a new creation, the old has gone, the new has come." Maybe even post this verse somewhere prominent and easily seen.

Jesus came that first Christmas so that we

So, this year, as you start fresh in your daily habits, family habits, work habits, and social habits, let us live renewed, re-centered, re-focused, and redeemed. As we get to "Love All," may all come to know and "Worship Fully" our God and Redeemer! Oh, and "Happy New Beginnings!"

# Financial Update Year-to-Date Results

- November member contributions were 125% of budget or above budget by \$24,899.
- November expenses were \$4,893 above budget primarily reflecting increased missions disbursements tied to increased contributions.
- Year to Date income is \$79,668 behind budget and \$148,154 less than last year.
- Year to Date expenses are less than budgeted primarily due to lower wage and benefit expenses with open positions over the year.
- Year to date General Fund Net Surplus is deficit but \$25,843 better than planned as expenditures are also lower.
- ECC tuition is unfavorable and expenses are favorable to budget, resulting in a lower than budgeted net surplus YTD.
- Collection of the remaining 4.0 pledges will enable Cross View to finish the campaign with all bills and bridge loan paid.





Look here monthly for tips and resources to help you be your child's key faith shaper at home!

**Reaching for Hearts:** Use this game to teach kids how important it is to support each other as Christians trying to spread the good news about Jesus.

- Bible Connect: Mark 16:15; Romans 1:16
- Stuff: You'll need candy bars and clear packing tape.
- Play: Tape candy bars onto the wall high enough so kids can't reach them without standing on chairs. Tell kids the object of the game is to reach the candy bars without the help of furniture or other people. Let kids try to grab the candy bars. Once they've given up, have them work together to reach the candy bars.
- Cool Down: Ask kids to compare their first attempt to reach the candy bars with their second.
- Ask: What ways do you tell your friends about your faith? Why is it important to work together and support each other as Christians? How can you support a friend this week?

**Snowball Fight:** This game reminds kids of the power of God's grace.

- Bible Connect: Isaiah 1:18
- Stuff: You'll need newspapers, masking tape, a timer, and hand wipes.
- Play: Form two groups. Divide your room into two
  equal-sized areas with a masking tape line. Give each
  group an equal amount of newspaper. On your signal,
  let kids make newspaper "snow" balls and quickly
  throw them back and forth at the opposing team for
  two minutes. The object is to get more "snow" on the
  opponent's side when time's up.
- Cool Down: Ask kids to collect and count the snowballs.
- Ask: How did your hands look after the snowball fight? How is the newspaper like sin? How are the wipes like God's grace?
