Financial Update Year-to-Date Results

- November 2022 member contributions were 87% of budget or \$13,590 less than budgeted. November expenses were \$30,012 less than budgeted.
- Year-to-date income is 8.97% below budget or \$108,208 less than budgeted.
- Year-to-date expenditures are \$96,412 less than budgeted primarily in lower wage expense due to open positions
- Year-to-date General Fund Deficit of \$75,857 is \$11,796 unfavorable to plan. We pray for December contributions to make up this deficit to finish 2022 in the black.
- ECC income is \$9,979 less than plan and expenses are \$40,037 unfavorable to budget, resulting in a deficit of \$13,814.
- Each Restored! contribution reduces the loan balance and Cross View's interest cost enabling those funds to support ministry programs.

Both options would be ready for immediate action.

Restructuring The Associate Pastor Position

Organizations, businesses, and schools continually reinvent themselves to meet the ever-changing landscape they are created to serve. This fall, Cross View examined God's plan for how Cross View can best meet current and future membership needs and mission field opportunities. Cross View's goal continues to be "Developing fully-devoted followers of Jesus Christ along life's journey."

After discussion and prayer, Church Council and Personnel Committee members propose reorganizing staffing structure to incorporate current skill sets God has provided our church community to provide new ministry opportunities as we build His Kingdom. Your lay leadership believes God's plan for ministry expansion lies right in front of us.

Cross View's current leadership skill set mix presents opportunities to think differently about the Associate Pastor position.

• Amy Gundermann is currently contracted as full-time Interim Director of Outreach and Adult Ministry as well as the Praise Band Leader. She is currently exceeding expectations and is a LCMS certified Director of Christian outreach. Amy is Call eligible specializing in outreach and adult ministry and would continue as Praise Band Leader.

• The Reverend Doctor Reed Lessing was a Community Light School of Discipleship presenter the last two years. He is currently a professor at Concordia University St. Paul and serving as a part-time interim Pastor at a local LCMS congregation. Church Council recommends we contract for Rev. Dr. Lessing services by the start of Lent and begin the process of extending a part-time Associate Pastor Call.

This reorganization proposal positions Cross View to meet current ministry needs, grow future ministry opportunities, and fulfill congregation expectations while creating budget efficiencies.

Church Council invites you to attend a Town Hall Meeting at noon Sunday, January 8th in the Great Commission Room. A detailed presentation, including considerations driving this reorganization proposal, will be presented. A motion will be presented to the Cross View voters at the January 29th voters' meeting to approve this plan.

A YOUNGER FAMILY

Growing congregations need young families to accomplish their mission.

In the past eight years, I have observed the Andrew Johnson family as they worshiped and participated in the life of Cross View. As this handsome, young family matures, they witness to our Lord's presence among us at church and away from us in their community. Andrew generously responded to my questions in the following interview.

Q. How did you become connected to Cross View?

A. Andrew's grandparents, Jean and Dale Johnson, were founding members of Cross View. Although baptized at the hospital instead of in church, he grew up at Cross View. During college, we would attend together (Rachael as a visitor) to spend time with Andrew's grandparents. After we were married in 2009, we chose to continue attending because we knew it would make his Grandpa Dale so happy to have us in church with him. We're so glad we did. The special bond Grandpa Dale had with our son, Lucas, when he was so little is a memory we will always cherish and it would never have happened had we attended anywhere else.

Q. What keeps you so vitally involved at Cross View?

A. The warm Cross View family is so inviting and there are countless opportunities to be involved with the church. Everyone at the church is connected by the same faith and we truly feel at home when we're at Cross View. All the



friendships and connection points we've made over the years keep us involved and wanting to stay a part of the church family.

Rachael notes: one particular Sunday morning, when we had to arrive earlier for volunteer work, I was grumping to myself that I wasn't a church worker, why did I have to have so much to do that morning...when I realized that yes, though not a paid position within the church, we are *all* indeed church workers. It was a humbling thought that instantly dissipated my grouchy mood.

Q. What activities at Cross View particularly nurture you in the faith?

A. Together and separately, we have participated in the bell choir and played clarinet in service. We've had the chance to teach Sunday school and partake in regular small group fellowship throughout the year. Andrew has taught adult education class as well as youth Bible study, and Rachael has been the VBS co-director for the past few years and usually gets roped into helping with the Christmas programs, too. Most recently our whole family participated in the FMSC mobile pack in December.

Q. Are there some aspects of congregational life you would like to see a greater emphasis?

A. Overall Cross View does such a wonderful job with outreach and organizing numerous events throughout the year. A favorite of ours was the church-wide family picnic — fellowship and "chat time" in a larger setting is so important! (Rachael still misses good old-fashioned potlucks.)
