

Empowered for Witness

Daniel 2 is a good example. In this story, the Babylonian king Nebuchadnezzar has a dream and asks for help interpreting it. The king's interpreters include "magicians, magi, sorcerers, and astrologers" (Daniel 2:2). These magi? They're dealing in the occult. They work for a pagan king. And they're unable to interpret Nebuchadnezzar's dream. These magi are hardly wise!

Note also the story in Acts 13:6–12 where we meet another magi named Bar-Jesus. Bar-Jesus is also a false prophet, a sorcerer, a son of the devil, an enemy of all righteousness, and full of deceit and villainy. Bar-Jesus isn't very wise! And that's putting it mildly!

Why, then, does Matthew include magi in his Christmas story? It's certainly not to create a bumper sticker that says, "Wise men still seek Him." Matthew's message instead is this. Jesus comes for everyone—even people enmeshed in pagan religion and astrology; who are in league with the devil; and who are living in complete darkness.

This is the Gospel of the Lord! Jesus turned these



magi into humble worshipers who offered him gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

This profound Gospel encounter announces, at the very outset of Jesus' life, that the King of the Jews is also King of the World. Jesus has come, as Simeon prophesied, "To be a light for revelation to the Gentiles" (Luke 2:32). Jesus has come to be a blessing for all people.

Epiphany, then, is an appropriate culmination to our observance of Christmas. After anticipating the Light during Advent and welcoming Jesus at Christmas, now we affirm that God's intension is for his Light to go forth to the ends of the earth.

Like Easter, Epiphany is the first day of a liturgical season: a period of time that frames our worship as well as our reflection on Christ's mission to the world.

The movement of this Light — the life of Christ — is one that ultimately leads him to the cross. Even during Epiphany, we receive multiple foretastes of the suffering in store for Jesus; reminders of just how much it will cost him to reveal God's love to a world

engulfed in darkness.

How will Cross View celebrate Epiphany? Let us count the ways!

My sermon on January 5th will take a close look at Matthew's account of the magi. I'll also begin an Adult Sunday School class on God's Mission in the Old Testament.

In his sermon series that begins on January 12th, titled "Empowered for Witness," Pastor Steve will help us understand Cross View's mission to the world. On January 5th, he will also launch an Adult Sunday School on Empowered for Witness: Discovering your Unique Witnessing Style.

In February I'll preach and teach from 1 Corinthians 13. Truths from this famous chapter on love will equip and empower us to join Jesus in loving the world.

The word Epiphany comes from the Greek epiphaneo, meaning "to reveal" or "to make manifest." God gives an epiphany to pagan sorcerers called magi. God shows His love for us as well. Our response? We take it to the world!



Financial Update Year-to-Date Results

- The primary expense variances were lower utility costs, lower wage expenses, and underbilling of medical insurance, which will correct by year end.



CELEBRATING CAREPORTAL'S IMPACT

Picture this — a living room with no furniture, a tv on the floor, and toys piled in a corner. A kitchen with no tables and chairs. A bedroom with clothes stacked on the floor of the closet and other items on hangers. A bed frame with no box spring, but cardboard stacked up with a strong sheet of plastic stretching across and tied to all 4 corners to give extra support to the mattress placed on top.

A smiling little girl and her mom meet us at the door. They are thrilled that we have arrived to bring a couch, a table and chairs for the kitchen, a small plastic table and chairs for the child to sit at and draw. A kitchen playset with pots and pans which was opened and immediately used by the little girl to give pretend lunch to her mom. Three of our delivery team members got going on putting together a bedframe with a support platform and a headboard to support the mom's mattress. She was thrilled and said "I've never had a real bed with a headboard. Please take my bedframe and give it to someone else who is in need". A second delivery trip brought a tv stand and three dressers to this family along with gift cards to Aldi's where she walks for her groceries.

Picture this — a single mom with four children (ages 13, 8, 7, and 4). Mom has recently been going through extensive chemotherapy treatments for her breast cancer. While she's been in treatments and therapy, she has struggled to keep up with cleaning as she has low energy. The family has also experienced the recent loss of her brother (mom's support person), compounding her depression. The children help when they can. Her needs are great for supplies of food, winter accessories, and cleaning supplies. (See pictures of items delivered.)

The delivery was made of all the items requested along with five bags of non-perishable food, five bags of frozen food, and two bags of refrigerated items. Mom was overwhelmed and extremely grateful for the support. Our delivery team was touched by her story and her need during this stressful time. One of our parishioners is keeping in contact with her.

Did we make a difference in the lives of these families? Yes, through the giving of our money, time, possessions, and prayers we did make a difference to help these families, and many others, stabilize and strengthen for the next chapter in their story.

Thank you for your support and participation in the CarePortal ministry this year. We have witnessed the want and need that is right here in our community and we have answered the call.

Cross View LERT Volunteers Make an Impact on North Carolina

On Friday, November 15, three from Cross View, Marc Wedo, Rick Thompson, and Phil Johnson, headed out for a weeklong Lutheran Early Response Team (LERT) deployment to North Carolina. They were part of a 12-member team from across the Minnesota South District. The team was led by Pastor Kristian Bjornstad (who conducted LERT training at Cross View last April). The damage in central North Carolina (Asheville) was extensive from floodings that occurred during hurricane Helene.

The deployment focused on two communities in North Carolina, one in Clyde (about 30 minutes west of Asheville) and Tryon (about an hour south of Asheville).

Clyde work was done at the home of a member at Our Savior Lutheran. There, about half of the team worked on demo'ing in the members home, mucking out the foundation area, replacing a wood fence, and getting an outbuilding back on its foundation.

The Cross View team was based in Tryon at Trinity. A nearby stream turned into a raging river knocking loose the foundation of the church and filling the crawl area beneath full of mud and silt. As a result, all the flooring needed to be pulled, the foundation shored up, and about a foot of remaining mud hand removed through a fire-line sort with filling hundreds of 5-gallon buckets of mud and moving them about 100 yards away. Other work there included general clean up, tree clearing, and simply being a sounding board to members and neighbors traumatized by the destruction.

To learn more about this deployment and how you might participate with LERT in the future, plan to attend a presentation on the trip during the Adult Education hour on Sunday, January 26.
