INDIAN CHURCH PLANT AT CROSS VIEW

In the Old Testament, God's Word often uses the imagery of trees that rise and fall as an illustration of the kingdoms of the world that rise and fall. They grow powerful and incorporate into their branches all the nations of the earth, but as quickly as they rise, they fall and are no more.

In Ezekiel 17:22-24, we hear a Messianic prophecy about a growing tree that God Himself will plant. Unlike the kingdoms of the world that rise and fall, this kingdom will last forever, and all the nations will come to rest in it. This kingdom was fulfilled with the coming of Jesus, our Messiah, and with the inauguration of the Kingdom of God.

Starting on June 19, Cross View will see God's growing tree incorporate into its branches yet another nation right here in Edina and Eden Prairie. This will happen as our congregation hosts and Indian church plant on the third Saturday of each month.

Raised a Lutheran in India, Pastor Jacob Christy and his family moved to America in 2016 as a missionary to the Indian community. He was a pastor in India for 25 years and has been a church planter all his life. His wife's name is Blessing and he has three children – Sarah, David, and Nathan.

Pastor Jacob has already planted churches in Woodbury and Minnetonka. Cross View is his third church plant in America. His heart's desire is to bring the Gospel message to Indian immigrants and their families who are taking up residence in the Twin Cities. On June 19, he anticipates about 20-25 adults plus about 20 children. They will gather for worship, fellowship, and Bible study at Cross View, starting around 10:30 AM.

A formal invitation has been extended to Pastor Jacob and the people of his church plant to participate in the ministries of Cross View. We are so happy to have them gather on our campus and to share in our ministries. Let's do everything we can to warmly welcome them into our midst as God's growing tree continues to extend its kingdom branches among us.

Recap of Voters' Assembly Meeting May 23, 2021

We are grateful for the many blessings that 2021 has brought to Cross View. We are back open for worship services and classes. What joy it is to be able to see people in person. The Cross View staff has done an amazing job helping us to navigate the pandemic and bringing us back together. I cannot thank them enough. The staff has also been filling in for the open positions and have done a great job!

- ECC Tuition is running behind budget by \$13,268
 primarily due to vacancies in one room. They have
 had a few cases of COVID which resulted in tuition
 being reduced for families during their time of
 quarantine.
- ECC Expenses are \$7,833 over budget primarily due to expense timing.
- They have also had some benefit adjustments that took place at the beginning of the year.
- The surplus from last year, which was \$55,000, has not been touched. They have that to draw on if needed this year.

- Member contributions are running behind budget by \$36,219 (8%) and 2020 by \$18,176 (4%)
- Expenses are \$46,386 (10%) less than budget
- Key Expense Variances to Budget:
 - Wages and Benefits: Under budget by\$52,278 due to unfilled Children's Ministry Director, Praise Team Leader, and Administrative Assistant
 - Missions: Under budget by \$4,617 due to reduced member contributions
 - Facilities and Grounds: Over budget by \$13,179 due to timing of maintenance contracts and small repairs

- Administration: Over budget by \$4,989 due to timing of annual contracts
- YTD Net Income of \$10,598 is favorable to budget by \$10,167
- Bridge Loan: \$613,179
 - Annually Adjusted Interest Rate is currently 3.875%
 - Payments: Monthly Interest only of \$1,980 with balloon payment due in May 2024
 - Repayment to be made from collection of outstanding Cross View 4.0 – Building for Generations capital campaign pledges
- Permanent Mortgage is \$3,040,000 at 4% Fixed Interest Rate
 - Payments: Monthly Interest only of \$10,133 through May 2024
 - After May 2024, 30-year amortization payments would be approximately \$14,515

The Auditor performed review of the following areas:

- Testing general ledger balance sheet accounts and reconciliations
- Testing general ledger income statement and accounts reconciliations
- Overview of operating and internal control procedures
- Additionally, the auditor was an on-going resource to the Church's financial team throughout the year
- Balance sheet and income statement reconciliation procedures did not identify any exceptions
- Reconciliations were performed in a timely manner, well documented, and contained a small number of reconciling items
- A sampling of income and expense transactions noted no exceptions to established policies and procedures
- The pandemic did not appear to impair the Church's ability to maintain a sound system of internal financial controls
- The Auditor will complete a final review of the Cross View 4.0 Building for Generations Capital Campaign accounting and reconciliation when it closes in 2021

Church Facility Repair and Restoration

Prior to the addition, our church was valued at 9M, it is now 16M. We have more capital expenses and equipment that may need repair or replacement.

We are working on being more planful in our budgeting. In the past as things came up, we would use the funds from the surplus account. This is no longer the case as we have larger expenses. This does not mean that we won't need to ask members for additional funding in the future. An example is if several pieces of equipment go down that is not expected. However, Renee and her team have made a list of all capital equipment in our facility, along with its life expectancy and price. We will use this list for budget purposes.

Three Areas that Currently Require Repair/Replacement

- Roofing:
 - New roof sections added with each addition
 - For several years, "patching and repairing" the roof as it leaks has been performed, including leaks in the 1993 addition.
 - Patching of the roof cannot continue. It needs to be replaced
- HVAC Units Replacement: Eight units on old roof need replacement
- Masonry and Tuckpointing: There are several cracks and water is leaking into the building.

<u>Church Council Recommendation:</u> After reviewing several options, council members are blessed to have the opportunity to use this loan.

- Draw \$550,000 on LCEF Bridge Loan
- Start a capital campaign (TBD)
- Interest-only for 3 years; 3.875% variable rate (\$21,315/yr)
- Loan is already approved and in place with no additional borrowing costs
- Immediate access to funds to complete capital projects, likely reducing project costs
- Avoids risks that interest rates increase and borrowing costs increase in a new and different loan

Motion was passed to advance the funds and begin a capital campaign.

The vote passed unanimously! The church council is very excited to have a great group of people on the council

Update on Open Church Staff Positions

- Director of Children's Ministry: Many people are interested in the position; the committee has narrowed down to four candidates and staff will interview those candidates within the next 2 weeks. The plan is to identify two final candidates and bring to the voters for a start date in the fall.
- Praise Band Coordinator: Effective June 13th, coordination will be transferred to Sue Quist. After two years of trying to fill the Praise Team Coordinator position, during which Bob Cavalieri volunteered to "temporarily" step into the role, this decision was made. June 6th will be Bob's official last day in the role. Thank you to Bob for his service in allowing us to continue the Praise Team and to Wendy Cavalieri who helped with music selection.
 - Administrative Assistant: Two candidates will be interviewed soon.
 - Audio/Visual Coordinator: A 20hour/week, 6-month position is covered in 2021 budget. The job will be posted soon.
