Building For Generations Update

The Cross View 4.0 Building For Generations construction project started Tuesday, May 28. Signing off on Lutheran Church Extension Fund Ioan papers May 23 enabled Anderson Companies to begin construction. **Praise Break!** Initial work included tree removal, fencing off a construction perimeter, and placing the construction trailer on site.

A few parking and church entry reminders:

- All parking will be in the lower lot.
- The upper main church entrance (door #1) is closed.
- The lower church entrance (door #2) is closed.
- A sign designates Sunday and Wednesday night and weekday entry.
- Sunday worship and evening event parking is in the lower lot. Enter through the south ECC door (door #3).
- The east ECC door (door #4 facing the playground) is the main church entry from 7:00 AM 6:00 PM Monday through Friday.

I was blessed to make several new friends at the conference and tap into several community resources that could open some new and exciting doors for Cross moving forward. It was an honor for Cross View to host this amazing event to our community!



Outreach & Missions

GUATEMALA EXPLORATORY MISSION UPDATE

On April 24-30, Tom Koch and Pastor Steve Wheeler traveled to Guatemala on an exploratory mission trip with CALMS (Central American Lutheran Mission Society). We visited several sites that had been pre-screened in advance by CALMS missionaries. We met with local and civic leaders at those sites to find out what God was already doing in their midst and to assess whether or not Cross View might come alongside of one of them. The purpose of the trip was to find ministry opportunities that would allow Cross View members, led by the Holy Spirit, to sow Gospel seeds in Guatemala.

As you heard in the May *Clarion* article, we visited three major sites – Santa Cruz, La Union, and Gulan. After a careful analysis of each of the sites, much conversation with each other, abundant and prayerful deliberation, and a unanimous leading of the Holy Spirit, we recommend that our congregation partners with the very small village of Los Vaquez, located in the mountains surrounding the small town La Union in Zacapa.

The rationale for our recommendation is as follows. First, we saw tremendous need in this little village of 55 families. Second, no church or other outside organization has ever partnered with this village. Third, we felt that the village was of a manageable size that our congregation could truly make a difference by partnering with them. Fourth, we felt a very strong connection with Carlos, the Lutheran translator and missionary, with whom we would work. Fifth, the village had very receptive leadership that was excited to work with us. Sixth, we felt, by the Spirit's leading, that there was great potential for meaningful mission and ministry there. And finally, the village demonstrated a beautiful and sincere love for the Lord Jesus Christ.

On Sunday, May 12, we presented our recommendation to the people of Cross View during the education hour. The presentation was well attended, and there was a great deal of enthusiasm and excitement about the potential of sending future teams. We are tentatively looking at the dates of November 15-24 to potentially send our first team of 8-22 people. We circulated a preliminary questionnaire to those who were interested in participating in this first mission trip. We ask that those questionnaires be returned to the church office.

Next steps... There were many questions that remained unanswered after the presentation because time simply ran out. We will offer an open forum for Q & A on Thursday, July 18 from 7-9 PM at Cross View. At this meeting, we hope to answer questions, receive input, and prayerfully move forward with putting together our first mission team to Guatemala.

We cannot express how powerful our visit to Guatemala, and in particular our visit to Los Vasquez, was for us. The experience will forever change our lives as we reflect upon and pray for these beloved brothers and sisters in Christ.
