God's Top Ten

Hello everyone! I'm so happy to serve at Cross View!

Pastor Steve and I will be preaching and teaching on the Ten Commandments this summer. We're calling our series "God's Top Ten."

In Matthew 22:37–40 Jesus summarizes the Ten Commandments by breaking them down into two sections—love God and love people. Paul chimes in, teaching in Romans 13:8 that love is the fulfillment of the Law.

Without using the word love, a teacher in a creative writing class asked her students to write something that said, "I love you." Here's what her students came up with. "Honey, your hair looks just great dyed purple and bright orange." "These cookies you baked are hardly burned at all." "Sure, I'll go to the tractor-pulling event with

you. Looking forward to it!" "You take the last piece of apple pie with vanilla ice cream and caramel on top." What do all these ways of saying "I love you" have in common? They all involve what? Sacrifice.

That's what the Ten Commandments are all about—sacrifice. And they begin with God's sacrificial love for His people.

An important feature of the Ten Commandments is that God gives them after saving Israel. I can't emphasize the adverb "after" enough. The Ten Commandments aren't isolated tidbits on how to live a moral life to gain God's favor. Nothing could be further from the truth. Nowhere in the book of Exodus does Moses suggest Israel was saved from Egypt because of the nation's adherence to the Law. Nowhere.

God gives His directives to people who are already rescued, already saved, and already delivered. And God will continue to sacrifice everything. Finally, that would include His only Son, Jesus — on the wood of the cross for the sin of the world.

1 John 4:19 summarizes God's Top Ten. "We love because He first loved us."

Do you see it? The Ten Commandments deepen our ability to love — God and our neighbor. What could possibly be more important than that?

Martin Luther puts it this way. "This much is certain: those who know the Ten Commandments perfectly know the entire Scriptures and in all affairs and circumstances are able to counsel, help, comfort, judge, and make decisions in both spiritual and temporal matters."

They teach us how to love.

- April member contributions were 67% of budget or \$57,617 less than budgeted. April expenses were \$3,867 less than budgeted.

Tuition Support

Cross View supports church member families who send their children to Cross View's Early Childhood Center, LCMS elementary and secondary schools and adults enrolled in professional church worker programs in LCMS post-secondary institutions and seminaries. As a congregation, we feel that it is important to commit ourselves to members who seek this kind of educational experience. Therefore, the congregation annually budgets for tuition assistance and the Early Childhood Center has a line item in their budget for reduced tuition.

Application Timeline and Process: Families and individuals seeking tuition support for elementary and secondary

schools and post-secondary institutions and seminaries shall apply annually by completing a Commitment Form. The application period is June 1–July 1 of each year. Forms are available online by <u>clicking here</u>, at the church office, or by emailing Renee Kirchner in the church office (<u>renee@crossview.net</u>). The Tuition Assistance Ministry Action Team (MAT) will review membership and attendance records to determine eligibility. Tuition support is determined annually and is based upon funds available and number of applicants.

Notification and Payment: Eligible applicants and their learning institutions will be notified of the tuition assistance amount in August of each year.

STAYING IN THE WORD THIS SUMMER

As the summer months fill up with vacations, outdoor activities, and different routines, it can be difficult to stay consistent in our study of God's Word. Below, you'll find some suggestion for devotional materials and Bible study tools as you plan for personal and family devotion time with Jesus this summer.

Simple Steps Approach

Of course, you don't need a digital device or a purchased devotion book to dig into the Word! Here is a suggestion for a simple approach to studying the Bible on your own.

- 1. Pray for the Holy Spirit to guide your understanding and time of study.
- 2. Read a portion of Scripture. This could be a chapter, a paragraph, or even just a verse.
- 3. Summarize the reading.
- 4. Identify what the passage reveals about God's nature or attributes.

- 5. Consider how the reading comforts or challenges you personally.
- 6. Close in prayer. Thank God for His Word and ask Him to continue to shape your heart.

Devotional Tools

Choose from several apps (such as <u>BIblegateway.com</u>) that can be used to create reading plans, study the Bible with friends, receive daily verses, or listen to audio versions of scripture.

- Looking for a creative way to start faith conversations with your kids? Consider starting a group study with your teens through the YouVersion Bible App or use the Bible App for Kids for family devotions (<u>Bible.com</u> or <u>youversion.com</u>).
- Lutheran Hour Ministries (Ihm.org) has free devotions available on their website or by using their Daily Devotions app. You can also download their free 30 Days of Household Devotions Booklet to use with your family.
- Using the app WordGo (wordgo.org), you can choose from many different books of the Bible and then determine the pace, length, and depth of study.
- Access thousands of video-based Bible studies for personal growth or family devotions at RightNow Media. For free access, text CROSSVIEWLC to 41411 or go to www.rightnowmedia.org/Account/Invite/CROSSVIEWLC.
- Pick up a copy of Portals of Prayer at the Event Registration desk in the lobby. The booklet includes a short daily devotion and a collection of prayers.
- Stop by the Cross View resource library in the Fireside Room (213) and check out a book to aid in your summer study.

As we continue to be shaped by God's Word, we pray that our congregation would be Equipped to GO with the truth of His Gospel into our circles of influence.

PARENT CORNER



Teach children how to study the Bible.

Observation: "What does this passage say?"

Observation is taking a close look at what is going on in the passage of Scripture. Correct observations are key to understanding the meaning of the text. We need to read the Bible thoroughly, slowly, and prayerfully to understand what God is saying.

Interpretation: "What does this mean?"

Interpretation is trying to understand the intent of the author. Interpretation is affected by the culture in which the author wrote, the biases we bring to the text, and the context in which the passage is found. We cannot understand



a verse without understanding a chapter. We cannot understand a chapter without understanding the entire book. We should teach children to interpret Scripture with Scripture and to consult resources such as commentaries to best understand a passage.

Application: "What does this passage require of me?"

We come to the Bible for transformation, not simply information. God's Word has the authority to tell us how to live. We train children to obey all God's commands, not just the ones they like. Teach children that obedience is essential, not optional.

- 1. Reading aloud: Like many books written in a predominantly oral culture, the Bible was written to be read aloud. This is what God told His teachers to do (Deuteronomy 31:11; 1 Timothy 4:13; Colossians 4:16; 2 Chronicles 34:18) and we can do this for our own children.
- 2. Personal reading: By reading the Scriptures with our own eyes, we can reflect more deeply and prayerfully about what they mean (Daniel 9:2). We can teach our kids to get into a rhythm of daily Bible reading.
- 3. Music: He inspired gifted songwriters and musicians to present His word in song (1 Chronicles 15:1-24; Psalms). Start a collection of Scripture songs for your kids to listen to.
- **4. Conversation:** He told parents to remind their children of God's commandments in the daily rhythms of life (Deuteronomy 6:7).
- 5. Personal repetition: God commands his people to meditate on His Word, or more literally, "growl," "utter," "mutter," or "speak" to ourselves (Joshua 1:8; Psalm 1:2). Chose verses for your kids to memorize and teach them to recall the verse throughout the day under their breath.
- 6. Parables: Jesus often used parables to draw his listeners in, provoking the curious to search for more understanding (Matthew 13).
- 7. Study: God wants us to rightly handle and analyze His word of truth (2 Timothy 2:15). As kids grow, we can teach them to study the Bible for themselves.
- 8. Visual demonstrations: Often, God would command his prophets to not only proclaim His Word but act it out in some symbolic fashion, making the message take on a new life (Ezekiel 5:1-17; Isaiah 20:1-6). When telling Bible stories, have kids act out what is being read.
- 9. Writing: When we write the words of God with our own hand, it allows us to study His Word in a new way (Deuteronomy 17:18).








WOMEN'S BOOK CLUB

We have reserved 160 slots but could accommodate more if there is interest! TIME PRIORITIES FOR YOUNGER FAMILIES


Over the years, I have noticed Mark and Vicki Weber active in numerous ministries of Cross View, often "behind the scenes" getting things done in a good and humble spirit. A healthy, thriving congregation requires members who have servant hearts, as Mark reveals in my questions to him.

Q. Mark, what is your most important criterion when choosing a church family?

A. The Word of God must be taught in its truth and purity. I think of the church of Philadelphia in Revelation; God had no complaints or grievances with this church and noted of them "though you are weak, yet you are strong." However God chooses to grow Cross View, if we are like the church at Philadelphia, weak but strong, as long as God's Word is taught in its truth and purity, I will find comfort and hope in my church family.

Q. What unique gift has the Spirit given you to serve the Church and her mission?

A. Jesus noted of himself that "the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve." So Jesus, who in heaven, had heaven's resources at His disposal, came down from heaven to earth and with heaven's armies at His side, He



overthrew the Roman empire and set Himself up as supreme commander of earth... No, that's not what Jesus did! With heaven's resources at His disposal, Jesus came to earth and became the servant of all — giving His life as a ransom for many. My hope and prayers have been for the Lord to teach me to be a better servant.

Q. What person(s) inspire you to be a better disciple of Jesus?

A. Around the time of my Confirmation many years ago, 1 Samuel 16:7 very much got my attention. The situation at the time was Saul failing as king of Israel, and God went looking for a new king for His people. What was His criteria? Per 1 Samuel, "The Lord looks at the heart." So, David has been who I've tried to model my life after because God recognized him as having "a heart for the Lord" which set him apart from God's perspective. My hope and prayer has been that the Lord would mature me in my faith to have a heart for the Lord.

Q. Where do you see Cross View congregation five years from now?

A. Being on Church Council, this one is very much on my mind. Critical to Cross View's ministry, Cross View must continue to teach God's Word in its truth and purity. With that foundation in place, I see opportunity! The lies of this world are failing. People continue to look for hope from anything except God. And in the end, whatever God alternative they have made master in their lives will fail. My hope is that we will continue to mature the Cross View congregation in their faith, enabling them to take a stand and be a witness to a culture searching for hope.

Q. What is your favorite form of witnessing to Jesus?

A. I have a passion for apologetics – or the defense of the faith – or "Why do we believe what we believe?" The primary event that moved me in this direction was the release of The Truth Project years ago which helped me stitch together aspects of my faith in ways I hadn't previously understood. My pursuit of apologetics has been tempered with the energy needed to raise three boys, but with the boys setting up on the launch pad, preparing for launch, I see more time in my future to engage in apologetics.
