A Season of Growth

Summer is my favorite season of the year! Those of you who know me well may think it's my favorite season of the year because I love to ride my bike, enjoy time at the lake with my family, go

or enjoy other outdoor activities. There's no question that I deeply enjoy all those activities that are connected with summer, but there is something else that I truly love about summer. Summer is a season of growth. It's a time

when the grass grows, the flowers bloom, the trees flourish, and the sun shines in all its fullness. Summer is a season of growth!

Just a few short weeks ago, we celebrated the festival of Pentecost that focuses on the birth of the church and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Following Pentecost and Holy Trinity Sunday (in the three-year lectionary) is the longest season of the church year — the season after Pentecost. Starting June 2nd, the altar paraments, the color of our crosses, and other liturgical symbols will be green in color. While some at Cross View subscribe to the conspiracy theory that Pastor Steve has everything green in the church for the majority of the year because of his great love for the Oregon Ducks, I'm here to tell you that that is false! The season after Pentecost is green in the church year because it is a season of growth! St. Paul wrote in Colossians 1:9, "We have not stopped praying for you and asking God to fill you with the

knowledge of his will through all spiritual

wisdom and understanding." We grow as the Spirit works through the Word of God.

Ironically, the beginning of the season of growth in the church year coincides with the season of vacation in the secular world. While there is no question that we are all ready for a break from our labors during the summer months, let's make sure that we don't take a vacation from God's Word. Instead, with joy in our hearts, let's use the summer months as a time to dive deeply into God's Word through our daily devotions, our weekly worship, and our special events. In an effort to equip you toward that end, many opportunities are available for you and your family to grow in the months ahead. For young children, vacation Bible school will run from June 17–21. Our youth and junior high will have multiple opportunities, including, but not limited to, regular Sunday evening events, the Rochester Servant Event in June, and the Senior High Retreat in July. Regardless of whether you are in town, up at the lake, or on vacation, look for opportunities to worship at Cross View or elsewhere. Financial Update

Year-to-Date Results

- Year to date income was favorable to plan and 2023 actual.
- Year to date expenses are \$43,190 favorable to budget and higher than 2023. Wages, utilities, and accounting expenses are key under budget areas.
- The primary expense variances were higher missions expense (tied to higher contributions) being offset by lower utility costs and lower wage expenses.
- ECC income and expenses were unfavorable to budget with the major variance being tuition income behind plan.

- ECC \$7,253 Deficit is \$7,675 unfavorable to budget.
- The Restored loan was paid off in March. "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever" (Psalms 107).

Application Timeline and Process: Families and individuals seeking tuition support for elementary and secondary schools and post-secondary institutions and seminaries shall apply annually by completing a Commitment Form. The application period is June 1-June 30. Forms are available online by clicking here, at the church office, or by emailing Renee Kirchner in the church office at renee@crossview. net. The Tuition Assistance Ministry Action Team (MAT) will review membership and attendance records to determine eligibility. Tuition support is determined annually and is based upon funds available and number of applicants. Notification and Payment: Eligible applicants and their learning institutions will be notified of the tuition assistance amount in August of each year.

GHANA ART DISPLAY DURING JUNE

Be sure to check out the traveling art display in the sanctuary during the month of June. This initiative was an opportunity for 400 students attending Christian schools and churches in the Twin Cities to create drawings of their most meaningful Bible verses for the purpose of being exchanged with drawings created by 400 hundred students attending the Frauenshuh Preparatory School in Ghana West Africa. Through this experience the 800 participants, teachers, and everyone viewing the exhibit have learned: GlobeServe Ministries was founded on June 9, 1996, at Mafi-Adidome in the Volta Region of Ghana by Reverend Samuel Anthony Kofi Dunya and his wife, Jonhild Freda Dunya. Both missionaries are products of the Bethany College of Missions, Bloomington, Minnesota.

As part of GlobeServe's outreach vision, the Frauenshuh Preparatory School was established in March 2000 at Adidome. The purpose of this school is to provide within walking distance an opportunity for children to grow and study in a well-defined and organized Christian environment.

The school is GlobeServe's way of bringing training with Christian emphasis to the needy in the rural communities. At the present time, there are four hundred students pursuing their studies. The goal is to develop people with faith today who will lead the Church and the nation of Ghana tomorrow. The school runs programs from nursery through junior high (secondary) schoollevels. Twenty-four guys, Cross View members and friends, attended the Arise with the Guys event. Many attendees met at Cross View and carpooled to Grace Church in Eden Prairie. Others met us there. Nearly 4,000 attended the event in total. Most of the Cross View group were able to return to Cross View for lunch prepared by Dave Wagner and his staff and for follow-up discussion and fellowship.

Over the course of the two hour-plus event they heard testimonials and faith stories from Paul Allen, Voice of the MN Vikings, CJ Ham, current fullback for the MN Vikings, and David Tyre, receiver for the NY Giants, retired. The morning was topped off with Tony Dungy interviewing Matthew Slater who was recognized by Tony Dungy as this year's Uncommon Man of the Year. Matthew is a retired wide receiver and special team player formerly with the New England Patriots. He is a three-time Super Bowl champion and ten-time Pro Bowl player. All the speakers emphasized their relationship with Jesus Christ as the most important thing in their lives and the importance of the role that men need to play in our homes and communities. Matthew Slater

closed out the morning with a strong Christian message, asking and answering five questions:

- 1. Who is God? He referred to Romans 1:20 and that God is the Creator of all the exists and all of creation screams out that there is a God. Creation is not an accident.
- 2. What is God's Character? Paraphrasing Deut. 32:4: God is perfect and just, faithful, and does no wrong, therefore; He cannot associate with humans who are sinful.
- 3. What is the nature of Man? Romans 3:23: For all have sinned; and all fall short of God's glorious standard.
- 4. What are the consequences of our sin? Romans 6:23a: For the wages of sin is death.
- 5. What is the solution? God provides the solution through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. 1 John 5: 11-12. And this is what God has testified: He has given us eternal life, and this is in his Son.

Matthew closed saying: Manhood begins and ends with this Truth: We can't do it on our own, we need Jesus. Future Men's Ministry events are being planned.

CAREPORTAL MINISTRY UPDATE

Our CarePortal Team launched 7 months ago, and we have recently



celebrated an exciting milestone: over 100 children in crisis have been served by our congregation (122 to be exact)! You can see more statistics below about the love-in-action that is happening through Cross View's CarePortal Team.

CarePortal Statistics

- \$111,095 = economic impact in our community
- 65 = requests Cross View has responded to
- 45 = deliveries made to families

Many of the items purchased were funded by the \$11,491.00 of generous donations made to our CarePortal fund. Others were personally purchased by team members. God has provided language interpreters for 5 deliveries through our congregation including Spanish, French, Russian, and Croatian. One group of volunteers helped to clean a family's apartment and another Cross View member knit winter hats for the CarePortal families.

It is hard to summarize the responses from the families we are serving and the partnering agencies, but there is an overwhelming sense of gratitude. In a recent meeting with the social workers that enter the requests into CarePortal, they referenced their amazement at the rapid response, the respectful interactions, the person-centered communication, and the warmth that they have seen among our team.

Currently, we have 10 shoppers, 10 delivery team members, 6 collection team members, and 5 interpreters. There is always room for more! Reach out to Pam Olsen at careportal@crossview.net to find out more or watch for additional training opportunities in the fall.


SUMMER WELCOME MAT ADDITIONAL VOLUNTEERS NEEDED
