Continue His Mission with a Heart for the Harvest

The theme for our 2018-2019 year in ministry is Heart for the Harvest from Matthew 9:35-38. To keep us focused throughout the year, we keep coming back to this theme. In these verses, we catch a glimpse of Jesus' heart for those who have yet to hear the good news. Matthew writes, "When He [Jesus] saw the crowds, He had compassion on

them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd." Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few.'" Jesus had a heart for lost people. Jesus had compassion on those in our world who are deceived by Satan's lies. Jesus had a Heart for the Harvest!

For the past five months, we have celebrated five decades of incredible ministry. Through pictures, testimonies, videos, and our celebrations we have seen how Cross View members of the past have always had a heart for the harvest. We have reminisced upon their many sacrifices and upon their courageous efforts to reach people with the good news of Jesus Christ. As we look to the next fifty years of mission and ministry (and beyond), we are reminded that this is our time to have a heart for the harvest. This is our time to continue His mission with great boldness.

What will the future hold? We don't know for sure. What we do know is that we are called to press on with a sense of urgency as a plentiful harvest is all around us, and the fate of the next generation swings in the balance. Our message, our mission, and the truth of God's Word that we have proclaimed the last fifty years will not change. How we get that message to the next generation will need to be continually adjusted. Our upcoming build will provide many new options to reach upcoming generations.

In just a few short weeks, our congregation will sink shovels into the ground and undertake a watershed construction project that will position us to impact the plentiful harvest in ways we can't even fully imagine. The construction will undoubtedly cause some inconveniences, transitional challenges, and lots of dust. My prayer is that our congregational mindset throughout the construction phase will be one that continually sees the end goal. As you take those extra steps, are forced to park in a different space, experience adjusted programming, or have to worship in a temporary setting, count it a joy that these minor sacrifices will expand our ability to reach the plentiful harvest for generations to come.

While things may be torn up for a while, the months ahead are not a time for our congregation to step back or to step down in our mission and ministry. On the contrary, this is the time for us to bring our "A" game. In the coming months, we are going to need a strong core of volunteers to help with transitional issues. You and I may have to carry the cross and candles to worship like those early charter members. We might have to set up chairs here and there. We might have to start a new MAT (Ministry Action Team) to direct traffic in the parking lot.

Not only will we need volunteers for the various transitional issues, we will also need them for our ongoing ministries and programming. Strong worship attendance will be a key factor as we seek to maintain congregational unity and momentum in the coming months. It will also be essential that our financial contributions remain strong for our annual operating budget, as well as for 4.0 Building for Generations. Over all these things (and more), I would ask that each member of our congregation sincerely wraps this project and our ministry in prayer in the coming months. We can expect that as we seek to expand our ability to impact the plentiful harvest through this build, there will be pushback from the kingdom of darkness. Let us pray for God's protection, blessing, and guidance throughout the process.

We stand on the precipice of a new and exciting era of mission and ministry at Cross View. Let us prepare our hearts and our minds to continue His mission with joy and with boldness like those before us. It's going to be amazing to see all that God will do in and through this mission station in the years to come. May we, like Jesus, truly have a Heart for the Harvest!

Cross View celebrated the culmination of 50 years as a congregation on February 10 during two celebratory services in the morning, and a dinner and program in the evening. And what a joyous celebration it was!

Of course, recognition of the past 50 years began many months ago. Project Update

The Cross View building project continues to move forward. An early April groundbreaking will be dependent on frost out date and general weather conditions.

Over 400 sub-contractors had access to Cross View construction drawings. Anderson Companies, our General Contractor, prioritized bid submissions and reviewed major subcontractor recommendations with the



Building Steering Committee. Committee members and a recently appointed Owner Representative reviewed major sub-contractors. They looked at technical/qualitative information, cost as well as site superintendent characteristics.

The Building Steering Committee welcomed Sonya Kraft to our team. Sonya will be on the construction site during the project. She is an experienced architect and owner representative from the Frauenshuh Businesses. Sonya will oversee construction, verify work performance, assist with payment verification, and advise Scott Douglas, Building Chair. This donated position is another set of eyes representing Cross View during the entire construction process.

Building Steering Committee members aligned building scope to approved budget guidelines. Design and material modifications, placing some components on hold, and executing budget reallocations aligned the project with Church Council and Voter guidelines. Thanks to Jon LaCasse, Pope Architects, Nathan Neimann, Anderson Companies, and Scott Douglas, Building Chair, for developing modification suggestions for the Committee. They were able to choose modifications that ensured continued alignment to Cross View's mission of "Developing fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ along life's journey".

Anticipated March activities:

- Finalize Edina City permitting modifications.
- Receive construction schedule staff feedback.
- Work to continue programming during the 2019 construction project.
- Develop creative solutions that motivate members to attend Sunday worship as well as summer and fall programing opportunities during construction.

Financial Update

- Year-to-Date (YTD) receipts through Jan 31, 2019 were 16%, or nearly \$17K behind budget.
- The 2019 budget includes a 9% increase over 2018 results.
- Expenses were lower than budgeted, allowing for the small surplus.
- Commitment to ongoing operating fund pledges is as essential as 4.0 building for Generations campaign pledges.


