March is a time for youth ministry that is very sporadic. You never know who is going to be around each week because of spring breaks and youth are always coming back with stories about what they did and where they went. The stories that are told range from simple to complex, low key to big adventures, and from straight

forward to a little embellished.

When you think about the stories you like to listen to, what makes them that way? Is it the storyteller? There's nothing like the memories of crawling up onto grandpa's lap to hear a story or having mom or dad tell you a bedtime story. Is it the content of the story? Those books that draw you in and you just can't put them down. Or maybe the story is just unbelievable enough that you need to know what comes next. Financial Update

Year-to-Date Results

- January 2022 member contributions were 68% of budget or \$42,837 less than budgeted.
- January 2022 income was \$39,554 less than that received in January 2021.
- January expenses were \$2,077 more than budgeted with utilities higher than planned.
- ECC tuition was unfavorable and expenses favorable to budget, resulting in a lower than budgeted net surplus.
- The 4.0 Capital Campaign will require most of the remaining pledges to pay off the short-term bridge loan of \$14,892.

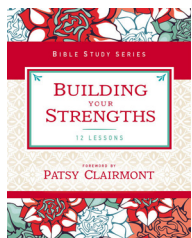

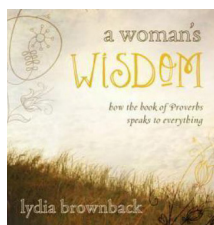

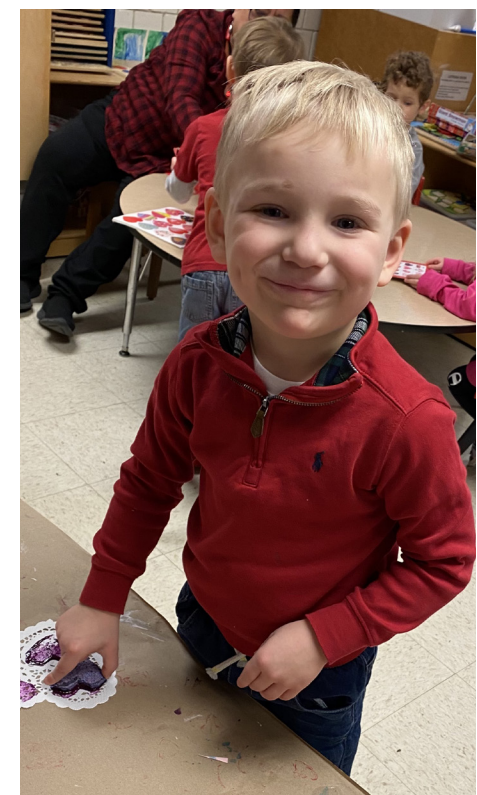

Simple Family Devotion Structure

- **Highs and Lows:** Each family member shares a high and a low from the day. A suggestion is to say a high is always required but not a low. Also, if a lot of lows are shared, then the same number of highs need to be shared, too.
- **Share a Bible verse:** Choose any verse you want to but here are some suggestions to start with: John 3:16, Deuteronomy 6:5, 1 Corinthians 13:13, Jeremiah 29:11, Matthew 28:5-7, Mark 2:23-3:6
- **Ask: What is God telling me?** Discuss what the verse is saying about God. Use the truth of the verse and apply it to your highs and lows.
- **What am I going to do about it?** Discuss what the Holy Spirit is putting upon your heart to do as a response to hearing God's Word. Your response may be a solution or reaction to the highs and lows that were shared.
- **Bless one another:** The Blessing can be as simple as a prayer or making the sign of the cross on each other's foreheads.

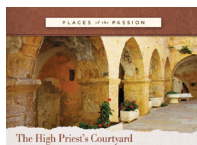


Lenten Services Begin Ash Wednesday, March 2

Our Great Commission Room Has a Cross!

Cross View just wouldn't be Cross View without a view of the cross! Our Great Commission Room now has such a view. Having a cross in the Great Commission Room was always a part of the plan, but due to some unique challenges related to the room itself and to some budgetary concerns during the build, the cross project had to be delayed.

One of the unique challenges of installing a cross in the Great Commission Room was related to the center dividing wall. When the room is subdivided, the center dividing wall fits snugly against the south wall. This prevents the installation of a centered suspended cross or of a 3-dimensional cross being attached to the wall.

For a cross to be installed in the center of the focus wall required that the cross be built into the wall itself. With help from Pope Architects, Chris Roth, Interscapes Inc., Pulse Electric, and Reach Communications, a plan was developed. Special thanks to Denny Scheppmann for diligently working with and coordinating with the contractors and staff to see the project through to completion. He did an amazing job!

The cross itself mimics the shape of the original 1969 cross in the main sanctuary. It also incorporates the refreshed version of the cross that can be seen on the exterior walls of the Great Commission Room from the lower and upper parking lots. The cross is backlit with LED technology that allows us to change the color with the seasons of the church year. Control of the cross is integrated into the room's lighting system and controlled from the AV booth.

Special thanks to those who provided memorials that funded this project. May this cross remind all who enter the Great Commission Room of Jesus' great love for the world!



Drive-Through Communion Resumes March 13

In the past several months, Cross View Staff and the Spiritual Care Ministry Action Team (MAT) have been making extra efforts to reach out to the Cross View membership, especially those who have been unable to worship in-person for various reasons. We want every member of Cross View to know that they are a beloved part of the body of Christ. We miss them and long to share fellowship with them in-person once again when possible.

What we have discovered is that members of our congregation have many different reasons for not attending in-person. As we await that time when we are all reunited, we continue to assess ways that people can stay connected to the body of Christ. The most important connection we have heard from those contacted is our online stream for worship and Bible classes. We are so blessed to have volunteer teams that makes this happen on a weekly basis. Please thank those volunteers the next time that you see them!

Another point of connection that people shared they would utilize is our drive-through communion if we resumed offering it.
