

Longing for God's Mercy

What do you long for? Sometimes we long for a relationship to improve, a loved one's health to take a turn for the better, or relief from a challenge at work. Longing implies we want something to change. Often our longings are so personal, we hesitate to share them with others. During the season of Lent, we are given the opportunity to experience longing for God's mercy. We intentionally set aside this time before Easter to solemnly consider our need for Jesus and His redeeming work on the cross for us. I encourage you to lean into Lent and use this time as "spring cleaning" of the heart. Look closely and honestly at the evidence of brokenness in your life and take time to long for our Savior.

The phrase "you break it, you buy it" is used as

a reminder that responsibility is placed on the one who is at fault for a broken item. If it is broken, the item is considered worthless to the shop owner. As you reflect on your own brokenness this Lenten season, remember that God's approach is different. Instead of finding the broken to be worthless, He has declared the broken to be priceless. Psalm 51:16-17 states, "You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it; you do not take pleasure in burnt offerings. My sacrifice, O God, is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart you, God, will not despise."

Jesus came to purchase and redeem this fallen world. He is not holding out for the flawless or perfect. He is looking for the broken. He takes delight in you in the midst of your brokenness!

Our theme at Cross View this year is "Ready" and our theme verse 1 Peter 3:15 reminds us, "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have."

Knowing that God gathers up the broken and offers redemption gives us hope. Are you ready to share that hope with those around you? Is there someone God has placed in your life who needs to

hear this good news? Are they longing to know that Jesus has purchased the broken-hearted? Pray for an opportunity to "give the reason for the hope that you have." Invite them to join us for EasterFest or for worship this Easter at Cross View.

May you find comfort in the open arms of Jesus this Lenten season and be ready to share the hope that we have in His redeeming love.


Financial Update

Year-to-Date Results

- January member contributions were 88% of budget or \$13,960 less than budgeted. January expenses were \$35,666 less than budgeted.
- Key drivers to lower expenses: Voter approved wage increase not processed in January and Xcel Energy billing delayed. These will be paid in February.
- ECC income was \$9,704 less than plan due to openings in two rooms and state assistance payments are behind.
- ECC expenses are below plan due to Voter's approved wage increases not processed in January.
- Each contribution to the Restored! fund reduces the outstanding loan thereby reducing interest costs.
- The Restored! campaign is currently \$138,228 short in pledges to fully repay the loan by the May 2024 maturity date.



Lenten Series: Witnesses to Christ


John tells us why he wrote his gospel. "Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." (John 20:30–31) Life! When we believe that Jesus is the Christ, God gives us life — abundant life, forgiven life and eternal life.

This Lent our new life in Christ will be strengthened as we journey to the cross with people from John's gospel. Plan to meet ruthless villains — like Barabbas and Pontius Pilate — as well as notorious sinners such as Peter (who denied Jesus three times), Mary Magdalene (who was possessed by seven demons), and Judas Iscariot (who betrayed Jesus for thirty pieces of silver).

Historically, the fourth gospel is likened to an eagle — an image that suggests John soars to heights of glory and grandeur. That's because the evangelist paints a stunning portrait of Jesus who is the Bread of Life, the Resurrection and the Life, and the Way, the Truth and the Life. Life in Jesus. That's God's gift to you! Watch for take-home devotion materials based on this series which will be available at the Welcome Center.

Cross View Welcomes Rev. Dr. Reed Lessing

On February 22, Ash Wednesday, Cross View welcomed the Rev. Dr. Reed Lessing as he officially began his ministry among us as a part-time associate pastor. That said, Dr. Lessing is no stranger to Cross View. In fall of 2021, Dr. Lessing led the inaugural session of Community Light School of Discipleship (CLSD) at Cross View, focusing on "Discipleship and Missions in the Old Testament." In the fall of 2022, he led the fall session of CLSD, focusing on "This is My Story, This is My Song: Insights from Exodus." Dr. Lessing's work among us begins as he leads our Wednesday evening Lenten services with a series he published entitled Witnesses to Christ: People from His Passion.

Dr. Lessing's position was established as a part of the restructuring of Cross View's associate pastor position. Generally speaking, Dr. Lessing will cover the preaching and teaching components of the former associate pastor position while Amy Gundermann covers the outreach and Christian education components of the position. The associate pastor call committee in partnership with the church council are currently moving forward with necessary steps toward recommending that the congregation extend a call to Dr. Lessing as Cross View's associate pastor.

Dr. Lessing is a Professor of Theology and Ministry at Concordia University in Saint Paul and the Director of the Center for Biblical Studies. He served for over twenty years in parish ministry. He also served fourteen years as a professor at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis. He is the author of five commentaries in the Concordia Commentary Series — Isaiah 40–55, Isaiah 56–66, Amos, Jonah, and Zechariah. He has written three additional books on the Old Testament, including *Deliver Us: God's Rescue Story in Exodus*



(Concordia Publishing House, 2022) and Overcoming Life's Sorrows: Studies in the Book of Jeremiah (Concordia Publishing House, 2021). Reed has also written sermon series, Bible Studies, and devotional booklets for Concordia Publishing House, Concordia Seminary, and Creative Communications for the Parish. We will be using his devotional booklet entitled Witnesses to Christ during the season of Lent. Copies are available at the Event Registration desk (one per family).

Dr. Lessing is a loving father and a proud grandfather! In addition to visiting his children and grandchildren, he loves to ride his bicycle. He is an avid cyclist! You might see him "flying" down the streets of Saint Paul. He also loves to run and even regularly attends a Yoga class! But more than anything, Dr. Lessing loves the Lord and loves to spend time in God's Word, sharing that Word with others. You won't want to miss his sermons and Bible studies!







PARENT CORNER



Ever wanted to see how Jesus completes the Biblical story and ties all the books together? Here is a brief overview of the Bible to help us understand the whole picture.

Bible Summary

The Bible is simply God's inspired story of him and his people. It relates how he took the non-ordered creation and ordered every visible thing and every physical law of the earth and the cosmos (Genesis 1,2). God took up residence within that creation and dwelt with Adam and Eve in a palatial sinless garden. He made humanity in his image to be his representation to that creation (also Genesis 1,2). When humanity failed and sinned against God and lost that intimacy with God (Genesis 3), God had a plan in place to reorder creation and bring everything to rights again. God chose Abraham and his descendants through Isaac to start the long arduous journey to bring healing to the world once more (rest of Genesis). Through the means of the Exodus from Egypt, the temple and giving of the law, followed by the wondering through the wilderness (Exodus to Deuteronomy) with the leadership of an initial recalcitrant Moses followed by his successor (Joshua) along with the imperfect patriarchs (Genesis), judges (Judges), kings (Ruth through 2 Chronicles), and prophets (Isaiah through Malachi), God wielded history (and provided wisdom with Psalms through Song of Solomon) employing imperfect people to bring about the perfect circumstances into which God would send his Son to be the one who would bring all of God's plan from the start to its climax. Jesus arrived and became the very locus of God's presence with humanity. Jesus showed us the Father and what it looked like to live a truly human life and run the world as it should be run (Matthew through John). Wherever Jesus went he made earth as it is in heaven. When Jesus offered his life as the sacrifice for sin, he opened the door once more to God's intimate presence for all who would believe. Jesus taught the apostles and disciples how to conduct ministry and lived the life

God wanted in front of them so they in turn could educate us (Acts through Jude). His resurrection began the new creation into which we also will join when he returns in glory to this earth to make this home of ours the New Heaven and New Earth (Revelation). Just before he ascended into heaven to be seated with the Father as the true ruler of this world, he tasked each disciple then and all those disciples to come with the responsibility of being his redeemed image to this broken world. It is our blessing to bring God's good news of healing and redemption to a dark world in supreme need of his light.
