Who ARE you?

Beloved Cross View family,

How would you answer the question, "Who ARE you?" (not "Who are YOU?") As you think about your answer, you really start to dig into the heart of your identity. In his book *Loved & Sent*, Jeff Cloeter, Senior Pastor of Christ Memorial Lutheran Church, St. Louis, Missouri, says, "As Christians, we often stutter when questioned. Who are you?"

It's fascinating how we answer that question. So often, we derive our identity from within ourselves. In his book, Pastor Cloeter encourages

us to ground our identity not from inside ourselves but from outside of ourselves. Let yourself be defined by God.

So, we've gotten hold of the answer to Who am I? Now we're able to answer an even more powerful question: Why am I? (What is my purpose in this life here on earth, in this community, family, circle of friends? What's God given me to do?). These two questions (who and why) are at the very root of human existence, and as Jesus followers, we're actually able to find the answers to these fundamental questions. And the answers, as Pastor Cloeter states in his book, are "loved" and "sent". Who are you? One loved by God. Why are you? Sent for God's purpose.

In our current sermon series and during Education hour, we're exploring what it means to be *loved* more than you can imagine and *sent* with more purpose than you thought. We're diving into Scripture and exploring what it means to have a Christian identity and purpose, and how to it apply to our daily lives. Beloved, we are walking into spring, a time of flowers and trees blooming. Join us as we walk into this new season and discover together that you and I, and the people God has placed in our lives, are loved more than we can imagine and sent with more purpose than we ever thought possible.

Financial Update – Year-to-Date Results


- March contributions were \$18,634 below budget and \$28,748 less than March 2020.



We are POBLO Ministries (International Friendship Center, aka 'IFC"). "We" means Cross View and other Lutheran churches joining us as "we" work with immigrants and internationals in the Twin Cities. Folks arrive here at different times in a very diverse city but never fully get a chance to be helped or guided. "We" seek to create relationships with families from different cultural and religious backgrounds. We (the Alaraj family) serve as liaisons between our American brothers and sisters in the church to connect and serve so that "we" can fulfill spiritual, physical, and emotional needs. Together, "we" connect with these families by offering free classes like English, citizenship, PC, sewing, knitting, etc. However, the most important thing is that "we" treat them as a family. Most of them don't know about The Lord, and through close relationships (especially with servants from Cross View), we introduce to them the love of Jesus in different ways and conversations.

Most recently, with the coronavirus pandemic's ramifications, several families have lost their jobs or have an understandable but higher sense of fear and need to be prayed with or helped out directly.
