# Cross View's 38th Christian Art Festival Creating for God's Glory

Cross View is excited to celebrate the return of the festival after a two-year break. In addition to Cross View's yearly Festival Art Exhibit featuring art by regional artists that is displayed in the Sanctuary, two additional exhibits will be featured:

- Eden to Eternity, Molas from the San Blas Islands
- Faith and Culture Art from West Africa

#### **Eden to Eternity, Molas from the San Blas Islands**

On loan from the Sandra Bowden Collection



The mola is the signature textile craft of the Cuna Indian women of the San Blas Islands, an archipelago of more than 300 islands on Panama's northern coast. Developed to provide elaborate front and back fabric panels for the traditional blouse worn by the women, the technique involves a process of reverse applique which combines layers of brightly colored fabrics stitched together and then cut into intricate patterns, exposing colors from underlying layers. The top layer is typically treated with both direct applique and embroidery to create an even richer surface. Animals and marine life are common motifs for the molas, as are geometric and mythological patterns. The collection in this exhibition features whimsical interpretations of Biblical stories and symbols.

#### Faith and Culture — Art from West Africa

Fabrice Eteka was born, raised, and learned art in Togo, a small town in west Africa. His main inspiration is from Africa and all the things he has seen in different countries. Now as an American citizen, he connects the reality and abstract to express his ideas. His life experiences and his faith in God inspire the artwork.

# Nationally Known Artist William Butler Presentation, May 22, 9:30 AM

William Butler is an established, nationally known artist living and working in Camden, NJ. He creates beautiful, inspirational commissioned, live, and studio artwork. His paintings have been purchased from coast to coast. William's paintings are luminous and layered embedded with themes of inspiration and hope. He brings more than 25 years of experience as an artist and a graphic designer to each painting.

# **Financial Update**

#### Year-to-Date Results

- March 2022 member contributions were 97% of budget or \$2,868 less than budgeted.
- Year to Date member contributions are 10% below budget and 3% (-\$9,254) below what was given for the first three months of 2021.
- March expenses were \$7,262 less than budgeted.
- Year-to-date Net Surplus is \$37,876 less than budgeted
- and \$58,745 less than the same period for 2021.
- ECC income and expenses are favorable to budget, resulting in a net surplus better than budgeted by \$16,207
- The 4.0 Capital Campaign received contributions of \$14,235, which was sufficient to pay off the short-term bridge loan!

# WATER FOR LOS VASQUEZ, GUATEMALA, WORK HAS BEGUN!

The faithful community of Los Vasquez gathered for an outdoor prayer service to celebrate the kickoff of the Water for Los Vasquez project. Since this prayer service celebrating the kickoff, great progress has been made on the water project. Work on Phase I of the project is ahead of schedule.

Collaboration with the municipality of La Union has been reestablished and the mayor has now volunteered workers and heavy equipment to assist with the project. As you can see from the photographs, a backhoe was used to prepare the ground for the main holding tank. The members of the community were originally planning on digging this by hand. Needless to say, there were a lot of smiling faces when the backhoe arrived!

The main holding tank is now 30% completed.

Our brother Helio was able to negotiate with a local supplier and was able to upgrade the size of the pipe from the collection site to the main holding tank at no additional cost. This pipe was originally to be 2 inches in diameter and will now be 3 inches in diameter. The installation of the piping from the collection site to the main holding tank was scheduled to be completed by April 9th. This pipe section is over a mile long. All the digging required to bury the piping was dug by hand.











We thank and praise God that there have been no mishaps or injuries on the job site since the project began. Please keep praying for our brothers and sisters in Los Vasquez as they continue working on this project.



We witnessed the depth of our Savior's love and the lengths He was willing to go to redeem us. On Sundays, we saw the Word of God intersect with experiential activities in the series *Experience His Love*. As we sought the face of God, repented of our sins, engaged in prayer, received from our God, and experienced His forgiveness, we saw the rubble of the curse of sin, death, and hell transformed into resurrection victory through an unforgettable mosaic.

The Holy Week was definitely one to remember.

On Maundy Thursday, we not only gathered to worship, but we witnessed ten of our 5th grade students from the Welcome to the Lord's Table class receive a "Stepping Stones" blessing from their parents as well as their first communion from our Lord. At 4:30 PM on Good Friday, children and families enjoyed an interactive and age-appropriate worship service. This service equipped Cross View's youngest members with the training, resources, and tools they needed to go and to share the story of Good Friday with others. Two traditional worship offerings that same day provided a powerful experience for Cross View members to journey to Golgotha.

Finally, on Easter Sunday, Cross View celebrated the holiest day of the Christian Church year. It was an incredibly festive day! Between the two services, we saw over 512 worshippers which was, by far, the most we have seen on a Sunday since before the pandemic. The music, the message, the singing, and the energy that filled the sanctuary boldly testified that: "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!" The Easter breakfast put on by Cross View's youth enabled about 200 people to enjoy fellowship and joy on this great day of resurrection victory.
