Sing the Lord a New Song!

"Sing to the LORD a new song, for he has done marvelous things!" These are the opening words of Psalm 98. With each new stanza, this Psalm extends wider and wider the invitation to sing praises to God. In stanza one (vv. 1–3), it calls for the worshiping community to join in song and praise to God. In stanza two (vv. 4–6), it calls for all of the people of the earth to join in song and praise to God. In stanza three (vv. 7–9), it calls for all of creation to join in song and praise to God.
