Because You Say So

Luke 5:5: "...But because you say so, I will let down the nets."

Imagine: It's 8 AM. You're coming off of the night shift, cleaning and packing up all of your tools and materials. You've just spent the entire night working and have had no success. Nothing worked the way you intended. You don't have anything to show for your time spent that day. You're frustrated, tired, and ready to throw in the towel. Just then, someone with authority stops by and says to you, "You're going to go back to work for a little bit. Get it all back out."

Hypothetically, how would you respond? It would

probably sound something like "Are you nuts? I just spent the last 12 hours working my tail off and didn't accomplish anything. Most of my stuff is cleaned up, repaired, and put away and you expect me to get it all back out and keep at it? Thanks, but no thanks."

Can you relate? Have you ever been in a situation where you've given everything you've got and have nothing left? You feeling like you've got empty nets and no motivation or desire to try and fill them up?

We read in Luke 5:1-10 that Peter was the same way. He had "worked hard all night long and caught nothing." Can you imagine what he had to

be feeling? This was his job. His livelihood. How he provided for his family. Not only was he mentally and physically exhausted from such a demanding job, but it was also a big letdown for business. When you're in the business of catching fish and come up empty handed (or netted) it's a bad day.

Peter's nets were empty. Interestingly, the story continues. He says, "But because you say so, I'll let down the nets." Right before this interaction Jesus had been teaching the crowds from Peter's boat and something Jesus said impacted Peter. It impacted him enough to keep going and try again. The difference for Peter between empty nets and full nets is Jesus. It's Jesus' word. This is the same encouragement to us. If you're feeling like your nets are empty. Like you're done for the day, week, month, maybe even 2020, listen to Jesus' words from John 16 "...take heart! I have overcome the world." We can keep fishing, or working, or making an effort, because He says so. Because The Word of God filled Peter's nets. That same word of Jesus fills us with everything we need to keep going "Because He Said So."



Trinity First Thanksgiving is fast approaching. However, this year it will look differently. Our goal for this event is



to encourage and show appreciation for the staff and families by providing an opportunity to gather safely, eat a healthy meal, and just be together for thanksgiving. We partner with Trinity First

Lutheran School as they serve low-income families in the Minneapolis Phillips neighborhood.

We are working with Trinity First staff to give each of the 70 families a "Turkey-Takeout" basket. Each basket will contain all the dry and canned fixings for a traditional meal, mashed potatoes, corn, stuffing, etc. In order to accomplish this however, we still need help.

GUATEMALA MISSION WORK CONTINUES THROUGH THE PANDEMIC

The work of Cross View's Guatemala mission team continues, even though we are unable to travel to Guatemala due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Our mission team has formalized our group into Cross View's Guatemala Mission Action Team. Our team consists of Vicky Barton, RoseAnn Meier, Laurie Koch, Pastor Steve, Pastor Toby, and Tom Koch.

Two important actions have been taken by Cross View's Guatemala mission action team. The first is to move forward with a water study to be conducted by a Guatemala engineering firm. On October 6th, our team had a long ZOOM meeting with Charles "Carlos" Cohen, the CALMS missionary in Guatemala, and Helio Ramirez, who works for the provincial government, which includes the village of Los Vasquez. Following this ZOOM meeting, we determined the best way to approach the water issue is to have a comprehensive water study done for Los Vasquez. A donor has provided the funds to proceed with this water study. This donation was given in honor of Ed Whelan, a good friend and a wonderful bicycle mechanic.

The second action is to provide Wilson Vasquez with a two-year scholarship. Wilson is a young man from the village of Los Vasquez who is studying nursing and is in need of scholarship assistance. Two anonymous donors from Cross View are providing scholarships.

Our Guatemala mission action team has also set a goal of returning to Los Vasquez in April of 2021. This mission trip is subject to being able to safely travel in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Please keep the people of Los Vasquez, in your prayers. Please pray for their safety during the pandemic. Please also pray for the water study that is going to be done and that the engineering firm may find a solution for clean water. If you are willing to help, any donation for the people of Los Vasquez would be deeply appreciated. 
