- ECC Income is \$13,495 favorable to budget. ECC expenses are \$19,245 unfavorable to budget.
- ECC Net Surplus of \$43,950 is \$5,750 unfavorable to budget.
- Additional pledges of \$23,763 were received in September, closing the gap for Restored! Thank You!
- The Restored! campaign is currently \$52,445 short in pledges to fully repay the loan by the May, 2024 maturity date.



JOURNEY STEPPING STONE CELEBRATION

On Sunday, November 5th, Cross View will celebrate our 6th grade students with the faith Stepping Stone called Journey. In this series of classes with Cross View's families we try to help the older child begin to accept responsibility for faith development. At this stage children examine the scriptures and their identity in Christ as they approach the new experience of middle school. The student will be encouraged during these years to see discipleship as a commitment to gathering in unity with all the family of God, growing in grace by Word and sacrament, and going into the world to share the love of Christ. At the class for this Stepping Stone, the student and parent will discuss the student's identity in Christ, their confidence in Christ and how it can be acted out in their daily life. They will discuss the church's view of purity ßand abstinence.

PARENT CORNER



November is a great time to reflect on gratitude.

- Model gratitude out loud by being an example of it.
 Say "thank you" to others and even to your own kids.
 Call attention to it when someone around you does something beyond what's expected.
- 2. Make a gratitude tree or start a gratitude journal.

- 3. Read books about gratitude.
- 4. Find fun ways to express thanks and share love (even with the shyest of kids.) Your child can draw a picture, make cookies, write a note, smile, or give a thumbs up to express thanks to others.
- 5. Donate or volunteer with your children and help to put things in perspective for them. Talk to your kids about those who are less fortunate. Don't scare them, but don't keep them in the dark either. Understanding that not everyone has the same advantages will help them develop compassion for others and gratitude for their own privileges.
- 6. Let kids choose. Encourage kids to turn their interests into action. Whether it's a fundraising drive at school, a bake sale, or a run for charity, expressing their interests and using their skills for a good cause is a great way to boost their confidence and give them a chance to give back at the same time.
- 7. Make gratitude part of your day, every day. Create a pattern at bedtime or mealtime and ask your child to tell you three things they're grateful for. Even if they've had a bad day, it will help them and you end each day on a positive note.
- 8. Give kids credit. Be mindful of the fact that your child may have their own way of expressing gratitude, even if it doesn't fit your expression. Different kids communicate in different ways. For example, your child may be more comfortable giving a hug than a verbal thank-you or might show their appreciation by helping out around the house or drawing you a picture. Tuning in to your child's unique way of being thankful will let them know that even as they're learning new ways to give back, you see and appreciate the thoughtful person they already are.














HANNAH WELCOME PARTY

WORK ON THE LOS VÁSQUEZ GREENHOUSE HAS BEGUN

After a brief delay, work has begun on the greenhouse in Los Vásquez, Guatemala.

There are fourteen families that have volunteered to clear the dense vegetation, provide the labor to build the greenhouse, and then, to tend to the vegetable plants that will be grown for food. Cross View has donated the materials required to build the greenhouse.

The greenhouse will be 75 feet by 60 feet. A drip irrigation system will be used to water the vegetables. In the background of the first photograph, you can see the large, black, water holding tank. This is a new addition to the water system, devoted specifically to provide water for the greenhouse.

The vegetables will be shared by the people in Los Vásquez and some of the vegetables will be sold at the market in La Union. This project would not have been possible without the water project!

Digital Volunteers Needed to Spread the Word!

Cross View has been blessed with the capability to live stream to the community and to the entire world! We have also been blessed to have key support staff and volunteers to help make that possible. To continue to connect and grow by spreading the word of God digitally we need volunteers to assist with various support roles and services. We have been unable to stream Sunday Bible Studies and additional services due to our limited volunteers and have many inquiries to provide more live streams.

We are looking for 12 additional volunteers to help with the following:

- Streaming 8:15 AM service, 9:30 AM Bible study and 10:45 AM services.
- For each service we are asking for a commitment of only one time slot for any 1st through 5th week of the month service for a total of 12 hours of volunteering a year (hint: if you volunteer for the 5th Sunday that is only 6 times a year!)
- We have two 2-person teams staffed for each streaming service. One 2-person team in the Control Room to stream audio and video, and a second 2-person team in the rooms being streamed to manage audio/lights and video (i.e., Sanctuary, Great Commission Room, and rooms 209/210/211 for Bible Studies)

If you want to investigate what we use as core technology along with the high-level functions performed, feel free to Google each software system to learn more but be assured the Digital Team will fully train you to be an expert.

- ProPresenter this person flips the slides and reads the minds of the Pastors during the services in the Sanctuary or GCR displaying lyrics, slides, and media to keep singing and sermons in synch and on time.
- Allen & Heath Sound Board controls the microphones and sound in the room or on the stream. Do not be scared by the 100 buttons and switches, we only need to use a few!
- Wirecast be the producer of the live stream by managing the professional broadcasts and video controls.

Hopefully you find yourself inspired to learn more as you would be:

- Helping Cross View spread the word of God to as many people as possible!
- Volunteering and providing a necessary service. If you are a student, volunteer hours are needed for many honor or service programs. Anyone is welcome to assist who can focus for a full hour.
- Reducing the time commitment needed as many hands make light work. Adding to the existing team creates opportunities to stream additional broadcasts with more volunteers and increased flexibility of staffing.

THE INTERNATIONAL MINISTRY OF HARRY & CHLORIS WENDT Part 1 of a 2-Part Series

Cross View has been blessed for so many years through Pastor Harry and Chloris Wendt. Their primary mission was to teach the meaning of the overall story of Scriptures through Crossways International publications.

They traveled and taught around the globe in seminars including the Far East. Now in retirement at Heritage Village, I asked them to reflect on the amazing ministry they were called to.

Q. Chloris, what circumstances in your lives prepared you for your remarkable ministry of Crossways?

Glancing across the valley on a two mile walk home from her one-roomed school at the age of eight, normally very shy Chloris determined to advise God. "I never want to leave my Mommy and Daddy, or our farm (in Australia) — and I never want to marry a Pastor, because that would be boring!" She was the oldest (by six years) in the family so became her father's "son" as well as her mother's little helper. God had other ideas! Like her pastor-husband's family, her family members were committed Lutherans, practicing daily study of the Word and being a Christian presence in the community. Hospitality, music, and storytelling were favorite activities for Harry's and Chloris' relatives, when time allowed. Harry's Grandpa was a missionary from Germany. Three of his sons became pastors, another a church schoolteacher.

There is no doubt that the deep faith of the Wendt family was affected by Harry's mother's health (she developed Parkinson's Disease when Harry was 14 years of age) and his younger brother who was injured at birth. In his late teens, Harry studied graphic art. Thus, it became a powerful component of his teaching during more than 20 years of



parish ministry, especially as his first parish in New Zealand was 170 miles long. It consisted of 9 preaching places requiring a 4 days' journey once a month. Many locals thought we represented a sect. As Harry visited folk in our village, he often got this response, "Oh, you're the new minister. I don't believe in God." Harry responded, "Tell me about the god you do not believe in." The new friend obliged, whereupon Harry would announce, "I don't believe in that god, either. Would you like to learn about the God of the Bible? I am beginning a six-week course. No obligation. Just come." So, many of the local folk attended and either returned to their own church with determination to teach the course there or joined our congregation. Harry had continuous teaching of the biblical story throughout his parish ministry. We experienced many heartwarming conversions.

During Harry's parish ministry his teaching encompassed many opportunities. Because of his exposure to many types of ministry he wrote articles for the Australian Lutheran, curriculum for religious education in public schools, Lutheran youth, and women's ministry. He broadcast religious series on commercial and ABC (think BBC) radio and television stations. Since Crossways International (CI) was established, his curriculum has been used in prison, deaf, blind, and special education, along with homeless missions, and ghettos. Harry offered his presentation on an international site. That astonishingly expanded, resulting in his being invited to present his seminars in over 45 countries. Other missionaries, teachers, and pastors have brought the total to over 90 different cultures/countries, many of whom do not have a written language. These cultures were overjoyed to be able to immediately understand the Bible's story and relate it to another person or group. CI's mission has encompassed about 30 different denominations, indicating how many persons or leaders want to be able to join the dots of the Bible story.

Q. Please share some examples of lives that were changed through Crossways International Ministries.

A group of 80+ year old women who were studying the 2 year course, Crossways, were inspired to establish a ministry to school children who needed assistance with their language skills and general schoolwork. Their pastor conveyed these ladies interstate to attend Harry's five-day seminar. And a pastor dedicated himself to teaching Crossways to enthusiastic street people over a number of years.
