

The Colors of Autumn - God's Handiwork

I love fall and everything about it — colorful leaves dancing about, crisp chilly air, and the delightful colors of autumn. I find myself pausing and admiring the beauty of nature a lot during this, my favorite time of the year.

Creation has such a bounty of beauty that never ceases to delight. Have you ever gazed at a tree as a work of art? Admiring the twists and turns of its branches and the smell of cedar or pine? We find beauty everywhere in nature.

Isn't it wonderful how God created the lush green grass, the varying hues of yellow fall leaves, and the deep blue sky above.

God as the master artist, has created the "color scheme of creation." The Bible tells us that God is perfect in knowledge (Job 37:16), so we should not be surprised that the elements and laws of nature work together to produce a beautiful color scheme.

A favorite hymn of mine references the beauty of the earth. Classical scholar Folliot Pierpont (1835-1917) returned to his hometown of Bath, England, and admired the beauty of the

countryside in the late spring of his 29th year. He was so moved by how beautiful his hometown was, that he was inspired to write the lyrics to the famous hymn "For the Beauty of the Earth."

Each stanza thanks God for a different kind of beauty. In its original form it was a communion hymn of eight stanzas. Each verse ending with "Christ our God, to thee we raise, this our sacrifice of praise," which was referencing Hebrews 13:15, "Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise — the fruit of lips that openly profess his name."

Here is the 1st verse of the hymn. I hope you hum this pretty tune as you gaze outside at God's beautiful handiwork.

For the beauty of the earth,
For the glory of the skies,
For the love which from our birth
Over and around us lies:
Christ, our God, to thee we raise
This our sacrifice of praise.

- Year to Date income is 5.18% below budget or \$44,314 less than budgeted.
- Year to Date expenditures are \$24,603 less than budgeted primarily in lower wage expense due to open positions.
- Year-to-date General Fund Deficit of \$81,512 is

\$19,711 unfavorable to budget.

- ECC income was favorable and expense unfavorable to budget, resulting in a net surplus better than budgeted by \$6,565








Helping develop faith at home

HOW TO SEE GOD IN CREATION ACTIVITIES.

God's Creation Scavenger Hunt

Use this game to help kids explore the elements of God's creation. You'll need:

- Bible
- Paper
- Crayons
- •1 Egg Carton per Child
- 1. Beforehand, cut pieces of paper to fit on top of the egg cartons. Glue a piece to the top of each egg carton and draw lines to represent each of the sections in the carton.
- 2. Say: "Today we're going on a scavenger hunt to learn about God's creation."
- 3. Read Genesis 1:1-5. Say: "Find something in nature that helps you think about God's first day of creation."
- 4. Encourage kids to be creative there's not a "right" item that they should choose.
- 5. Have children place the item in the top left section of the egg carton. Have them write "Day 1" and draw a picture on the corresponding section of the paper on top of the carton.
- 6. Invite children to share what they collected and why they chose those items.
- 7. Continue the same process as you go through each of the other days of creation from Genesis 1:1 to 2:4. Have children fill each of the other sections of the egg carton with other things God created. They don't have to be items from nature—the point is to help them understand that God created everything. Invite children to discuss the various items they collected.

Take Care

Use this simple service project idea to practice being good stewards of God's creation. You'll need:

- Bible
- •Trash Bags

- •Disposable Gloves
- •Hand Sanitizer
- 1, Beforehand, choose a safe area where you can take children that has either a lot of litter or needs basic cleaning up, such as a park or empty lot.
- 2, Say: "In Genesis 1:26, the Bible says that God put us in charge of the earth and that we're to take care of it."
- 3. Read aloud Genesis 2:15. Taking care of God's creation is a responsibility but doing so also means we can live in a clean, safe place.
- 4. Ask: "What are ways you take care of the things God created?" "What difference does it make if we take care of God's creation?"
- 5. Say: "Working with others to love and take care of God's creation is a privilege." Explain that you'll all be cleaning up an area of God's creation. Take the children to the area you chose ahead of time. Encourage a fun environment by leading children to sing their favorite tunes as you work. You can also add a game element by having children try to fill their bags.
- 6. Ask: "What did you like or not like about taking care of God's creation?" "Whether it was all fun or hard work, why do you want to take care of God's creation in the future?"

OCTOBER FAITH STEPPING STONES CELEBRATIONS

Sunday, October 2nd Celebration of Journey Stepping Stone (6th graders)

In this faith Stepping Stone, classes 9/18 and 9/25, the child and parent examine the scriptures and their identity in Christ as they approach the new experience of middle school. The families will discuss their child's confidence in Christ and how it can be acted out in their daily life. They also discuss the church's view of purity and abstinence. On October 2nd, families will verbally bless their children at the 10:45 AM service.

Sunday, October 16th Celebration of Adventure Bible Stepping Stone for (2nd graders)

In this faith Stepping Stone, classes 10/2–10/16, families learn how to study the Bible for a personal quiet time. The student begins to understand that faith is personal as well as corporate and begins to assume responsibility for some of the practices of Christian discipleship. In this class families begin to learn to articulate the purpose of Scripture, its main story, the division of Old and New Testaments, and a number of its key characters. On October 16th, families will verbally bless their children and give them the Adventure Bible at the 10:45 AM service.


Cross View Churchwide Picnic
