HOPE

Have you ever been out in the ocean during a really bad storm? If you have, you know how helpless and hopeless it can feel until you reach the land, or the storm subsides—whichever comes first. For a period of time, you are at the mercy of the wind and the waves. Some storms are very dangerous. They can swamp a boat and sink it without warning. They can take you off course and dump you in the rocks. It helps a bit to be on a bigger boat, but even the

bigger boats can get tossed around in high seas. They too, are vulnerable in serious storms.

I remember one time I was salmon fishing off the Oregon coast. A huge storm developed. The Coast Guard shut down the jetty for boats to enter port. We had to ride out the storm on the open ocean until it was safe to come in to port. Quite honestly, it was frightening. Thanks be to God, we made it back safely.

Storms...and especially extended storms... can wear a person down. They can rob a person of hope. Such was the case for Jesus' disciples in Mark 4:35-41. They were simply going to cross over the Sea of Galilee when a huge storm struck. Jesus was asleep in the back of the boat. Terrified, the disciples woke Him and asked, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" Jesus got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet, be still." Then the wind died down and it was completely calm. He said to his disciples, "Why are you so afraid, do you still have no faith?" Scripture tells us the disciples were terrified and asked each other, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey Him."

Since the outbreak of COVID-19 in March, it has felt like we have been in a powerful and extended storm. Tossed by the winds and the waves of this virus, we have been left reeling, groping for some sort of relief. The civil unrest that began in Minneapolis and spread across our nation only seemed to intensify the storm even more. With no vaccine in the immediate future, it feels like we are adrift in open seas with no foreseeable end to the tempest. Extended storms like this one can wear a person down and rob them of hope.

Mark 4:35-41 reminds us of some powerful truths as we face the storms of life. First, like disciples, we are not alone in the storm. Jesus is in the boat with us at all times. His presence means everything! Second, with a word Jesus can bring calm and peace to any storm we are facing. Third, he bids us not to be afraid in the storm, but to trust in Him. Finally, we would do well to ask the same question those first disciples asked, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey Him."

Knowing the answer to this question...that Jesus, the Son of God, is with us in the storm fills us with hope. With this truth before us, our theme

for the 2020–2021 year of mission and ministry at Cross View is "Hope in the Storm." From what we can see at this point, it looks as though we may have some stormy seas ahead. We don't know what the year ahead holds, but we do know who holds it. Jesus will be with us in the boat as we ride it out. The uncertainties that we will face together in the year ahead will require us to remain nimble and flexible with our ministry programming and offerings. But in the midst of the storm we will have hope! In the midst of the storm we will share that hope with each other and with the world around us.

As we face the storm ahead with hope and faith in Jesus, we will need to be patient, nimble, and flexible. With that in mind, the 2020 schedule and major ministry programming that we will offer this fall is listed on the next page. Please keep in mind that we will continue to monitor developments related to the COVID-19 pandemic throughout the fall. We will re-assess the situation after Thanksgiving, giving attention to what is happening in neighboring school districts and the community at large. We will also gather information from our congregation to assess schedules and programming that will make sense after the first of the year.

Financial Update

YEAR-TO-DATE RESULTS

- Expenses continue to be closely managed. Year-to-date expenses through July were \$89,574 below budget but are running \$36,406 higher than through July last year. The parking lot sealcoating and other needed maintenance and repairs account for the majority of this increase over last year.
- We have utilized all of the CARES Act Paycheck Protection Loan Program expenses in accordance with the program.
 The Small Business Administration will begin taking forgiveness applications in August. Cross View anticipates submitting our application and documentation in August.
 We anticipate full loan forgiveness of \$169,412 for the church and \$204,091 for the ECC.
- The ECC continues to operate with reduced students and tuition. Year-to-date tuition receipts of \$612,910 are 22%

below budget. Expenses are also being curtailed, being \$17,213 below budget resulting in a year-to-date deficit of \$83,444. School districts have begun to announce fall attendance plans and parents will be making ECC decisions to firm up fall enrollment plans.

TRINITY FIRST UPDATE

Trinity First will be beginning the 2020-2021 school year using the hybrid model. They have split their families into two groups—the Blue group and Gold group. Each group will have two instructional days Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/ Thursday with Fridays alternating. The classes are grouped together into cohorts (like one-room schoolhouses) to limit the spreading of germs, but to also provide backups if any teacher were to get sick. Trinity First is looking forward to working with students in smaller groups after not being with them in person for 6 months. They hope the model they are using in hybrid could also transfer to distance learning if they move to that at some point this school year.

Trinity First is limiting the building to only students and teachers (parents and volunteers will not be allowed in the building), so they are actively and creatively looking for ways to engage volunteers off-site. They depend each year on the ways that volunteers serve the teachers, students, and families!

Here are specific ways you can pray for Trinity First:

- Pray for the teachers—for good health, for strong relationships to be built with families and students despite more limited contact, for patience and extra measures of grace as we begin an unprecedented school year during a pandemic!
- Pray for the families—many are still making decisions about what school situation will be best for them this year, pray for openness and flexibility as they work together to ensure safety for all
- Pray for their students—this is also a school year they
 have never experienced before so pray for them as
 they adjust to the new changes at school and at home






- Pray for their neighborhood—there has been an increase in crime since the riots, so pray for safety, unity, and peace
