

## Family Devotions, Anyone?

Can you believe the start of school is just around the corner? As you are reading this, school has already started with some children. Wow time flies! It really makes me think about how to make the most of the time I have with my kids be valuable to them. What do I want to instill in them? How can my husband and I shape and influence our children to be more like Christ? One way to do this is to start the pattern of a family devotion. It is said, it takes at least two months for a behavior to become an actual habit. So don't give up too early with something new. There are so many ways a family can do a devotion. Most importantly don't over think or over complicate it.

Once you create your own family devotional style you and your kids will come to expect it and look forward to these special times.

I love talking about God Sightings with my kids. God Sightings are ways you see God working in your daily life. God Sightings are easy and natural ways to bring up the topic of God with your children. An example of a God Sighting would be seeing a small flower growing between a crack in the cement sidewalk. You could say, "See how beautiful God's creation is even where it isn't expected." Another example of a God Sighting would be praying in the car together after you see an ambulance or police car drive

by with their sirens on.

Another great way to have a family devotion is by simply reading the Bible together. You can use the acronym SOAP which stands for Scripture, Observe, Application, and Prayer. First, pick a Scripture to read together and then you can ask each other questions about it for the Observation time. What are some of your general impressions? What is being said? What is the Bible teaching? What is the theme? Ask some good Application questions. How does this passage affect my present concept of God or my relationship with Him and others? How does this passage relate to the Gospel message of the entire Bible? What are you going to do about what God is teaching you in His Word? Finally, end in a group Prayer. You can pray about your day, any particular requests, and offer praise.

Personally, I have really enjoyed some good family devotional books. The devotional book "The One Year Praying Through the Bible for Your

Kids" by Nancy Guthrie is great. It offers many ways to involve Scripture when praying for your kids on your own. Sarah Young has a series of books called "Jesus Calling" that are written from the perspective of Jesus talking directly to you. Besides her adult devotionals there are devotional books specifically for boys, girls, teens, and kids. "My First Hands-on Bible" by Group Publishing is written for children under age five and includes great discussion questions, activities, and always points the story back to Jesus. "Friends with God Devotions for Kids" by Mikal Keefer is written for children seven years of age and older. It has 54 of the main Bible stories and always ends with how the Word should relate to you and God and you and others. There are a lot of great resources out there. Be sure to check out the resource wall downstairs by the youth room or ask me for other suggestions anytime.

She grew up going to Camp Omega and served as a Youth Servant Leader.




### NEW MEMBER CLASS STARTING SEPTEMBER 17 AT 9:30 AM

### BIBLE STUDY FELLOWSHIP (BSF) FOR WOMEN & PRESCHOOL CHILDREN


Cross View women, please join us for Bible Study Fellowship's study of John on Tuesday's from 12:30–2:00 PM.

Women today face a multitude of challenges, like struggles with insecurity, broken relationships, guilt, overwork, or loneliness. Countless women have found peace, comfort, hope, security, and answers to life's big questions by exploring God's Word. As a group member, you will personally study Scripture and answer questions each day. Once a week, you will meet for a small-group discussion of the lesson, hear from a teaching leader how the truths of Scripture can be applied to daily life and receive comprehensive notes on the Scripture passages you studied.

BSF's Preschool Program gives children a biblical foundation upon which to build a love for God and spiritual matters. Loving, well-trained and committed leaders teach little ones about God and the Bible in age-appropriate ways. The leaders pray for the children and encourage them

to continue learning with their registered adult throughout the week. (The preschoolers' curriculum is based on the lessons the adults study to help foster spiritual conversations at home.) The children also learn other important life skills, such as how to obey instructions, cooperate, sit, and listen — all taught in an atmosphere of love.

### Focus on the Family of Cross View by Paul Emmel

### LIVING FAITHFULLY, JOYFULLY, AND GRATEFULLY EACH DAY

There is much more to life than we experience on Earth. Steve and Jan Schrader share their encouragement for finding God's purpose each day while looking forward to eternal life.

Q. Steve and Jan, every time I see you, I am encouraged. What has our Lord been teaching you through all your health trauma in recent years?

Steve: To borrow from a hymn title, "I'm But a Stranger Here;" heaven is my home. In my vigorous and active youth, the thought of death was almost beyond imagination. As I now have a closer view of the finish line and feel the effects of a very broken body, I have come to realize how fleeting these days are and how long eternity is. While I still want to be the best I can be for the Lord here on this earth, I have come to treasure the promises of Jesus for the end of this earthly life. Jan and I have truly come to embrace the blessing of the day, the hour, the moment. Rich treasures now, but better ones to come!

Q. How are you both inspired not only to survive but even grow during this long season of suffering?

Steve: This has been a tough one for me. I have learned that apathy and loss of motivation are characteristics of Parkinson's disease (from which I suffer). Previously, I had been so puzzled by how disinterested I had become in things I had so been looking forward to in retirement. I'm glad to have learned this because you can deal with "the enemy" much better when you know he's there. As long as God gives us breath, He has a useful purpose in mind for us to serve him, and I need to seek that purpose every day. I get so much inspiration from my dear wife, who has been such an example of perseverance in ministry, even while suffering through much greater health challenges than those with which I have had to deal!

Q. Humanly speaking, who in particular has been your "light in the dark?"

Steve: I have been richly blessed by the life of my dad, who served over 40 years as a Lutheran pastor. Although we had the "required" challenges of my high school years (my problem, NOT his!) we had a good relationship. When my mom died at the age of 53, my dad was an absolute rock in the darkness of my sorrow. We had been father/son to that point, but we became great friends after that. He was such a humble man and loved his "sheep" so tenderly. It's what he was in ministry to do! At his memorial service at the church he had started, my family felt the pastor chose the perfect title for his sermon: "Good Shepherding, Carl." I was so blessed to have special access to this shepherd, and his manner is the way I want to treat people.



O. After all these years, why are you still faithfully following Jesus?

Jan: I think of Peter's words to Jesus, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." Jesus is everything he claimed to be, true God and true man, Savior, King of kings and Lord of Lords. My resurrected Savior will keep his promise to prepare my place in his Father's house and come back for me when my earthly life ends so

that I can be with him forever in the new heavens and earth.

Q. Aging has its own lessons known only to elders. What are yours?

Jan: I think a truth that we avoid most of our lives is that we are all aging, moving toward eternity, so I've tried to treat each day as a gift. When I was forty, I had my first of three bouts with cancer. In 2001 my sixty-nine-year-old mom was taken to heaven suddenly as a result of a car accident. My dad died at ninety-one in 2020 after a short battle with pneumonia. I don't know how many days the Lord has for me, but I want each day to be lived faithfully, joyfully, and gratefully with the Holy Spirit's help.

Q. Would you give some examples of how the Holy Spirit is involved in the tiny details of your everyday lives?

Jan: Recently we were feeling overwhelmed, and Steve prayed that the Lord would intervene. Within an hour of that prayer, the Holy Spirit was working through our Cross View family. We received a text asking how we were doing and offering to help. Soon after that, another loving text came from someone in my small group. Just hours later, another couple called and brought over a lasagna supper, chicken soup and groceries!

Q. If you were given the microphone to speak to the entire Cross View Lutheran Church, what would you say?

Jan: Thank you, dear brothers and sisters in Christ. You have been part of the great cloud of witnesses cheering us on in our journey of faith, keeping Jesus and the hope of heaven ever before us. We praise God for his faithful love shown through each and every one in the body of believers in this place, from youngest to oldest!
